

From your pastor ...

This last week of January is dedicated each year in the Catholic Church in the United States for the celebration of our Catholic Schools. In the diocese of La Crosse, we celebrate the presence of one Catholic University, seven Catholic High Schools, with a combined population of 1,242 students and 58 Catholic Elementary Schools, with a combined population of 4,625 students. We celebrate in a particular way in our parish for the presence of our Catholic elementary school that has been serving our parish for the past 97 years. As a parish we should be rightly proud of assisting thousands of families over the years in educating their children in the Catholic Faith, as well as in the arts and sciences that prepare them for a successful encounter with the wider world throughout their lifetime. This year we have a total enrollment of 167 students, pre-school through eighth grade.

I take this opportunity to express appreciation to our principal, Mrs. Stacia Kohlstedt as well as our faculty and staff for their ongoing dedicated service to our Catholic School. While Jesus Christ is the head of our school, the faculty and staff constitutes its heart. This is recognized not only in our parish but the wider community of Richland Center.

We presently have a non-Catholic student population @thirty percent of our total student body. We welcome our non-Catholic families and students. This past year of 2023, three students, with the permission of their parents asked to be and were received into the Catholic Faith either through the Sacrament of Baptism or through a profession of Faith. It is important to note that students who are not Catholic are never pressured or cajoled into becoming Catholic. The Church forbids any kind of overt or subtle coercion, in that it would violate the freedom that is necessary for making such a decision. They do come to Holy Mass (without participating in Holy Communion) and participate in the songs and prayers to the extent that they are comfortable in doing so. Those who request to do so can read the Sacred Scriptures and also serve in the sanctuary during the Mass.

There is a great amount of sacrifice that is required from the larger parish to provide a Catholic school like the one we have in this parish. I very special thank you to all the parishioners who sacrifice weekly/monthly/annually in providing the financial resources needed to maintain our Catholic School. Over the years we have been able to provide a high-quality Catholic school while at the same time maintaining the upkeep of the entire parish.

The late Pope Benedict XVI once said about Catholic schools: "A good Catholic school provides a rounded education for the whole person and a good Catholic school, over and above this, should help all students to become saints." I believe this statement is true of what takes place here at Saint Mary's Parish.

Until I write again, may God continue to bless our Catholic school and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's parish.


