From your pastor . . .

This second Sunday of Easter brings to a conclusion the Easter Octave and is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy Sunday has its origin with the private revelations that were given to a young Polish nun, Sister (now Saint) Faustina Kowalska. On February 22, 1931 Saint Faustina saw a vision of Jesus with rays of mercy streaming from the area of His Heart. He told her to have an image painted to represent this vision and to sign it "Jesus I Trust in You." A reproduction of this image is displayed in the sanctuary of our parish church.

Calling her the Apostle and Secretary of His mercy, our Lord requested for her to begin writing a diary so others would learn to trust in Him. This diary has been widely published and can be purchased in any Catholic bookstore or online.

In a series of revelations, He taught Faustina that His mercy is unlimited and available even to the greatest sinners, and He revealed special ways for people to respond to His mercy.

By the time of Saint Faustina's death in 1938, devotion to Divine Mercy had already begun to spread throughout Eastern Europe. Returning U.S. soldiers who had been exposed to the devotion during World War II were some of the first people to bring it to the United States.

The message of mercy can be called to mind simply by remembering ABC. <u>A</u>sk for His mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly. <u>B</u>e merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. <u>C</u>omplete trust. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust.

The image that Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to have painted is a portrait of Jesus as the King of Mercy. The red and pale rays represent the blood and water that flowed from his pierced Heart as a fountain of mercy for us. There are different versions of the image, but our Lord made it clear that the painting itself is not what is important. So, no matter what version you prefer, you can be assured that God's graces are communicated through it.

Our Lord asked for special prayer at the hour of his death – the three o'clock hour. Usually, the Chaplet of Mercy is prayed at this hour (however it can be prayed at any hour). This Chaplet is prayed on the beads of the rosary. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed after the conclusion of the weekday Masses at our parish church. Jesus also requested (as recorded in Saint Faustina's Diary, 699) that the Sunday after Easter be officially established in the Church as the Feast of Mercy. This was done during the pontificate of Pope Saint John Paul II. We bring forth great goodness into our world and the lives of others when we carry out the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy.

A reminder that First Holy Communion will be celebrated next Sunday, April 14th at the10:30 a.m. Mass. Practice will take place at 10:00 a.m. next Saturday, April 13th. We look forward to this very holy and special day for the seventeen children who will be receiving our Lord for the first time in the Holy Eucharist.

Also, a reminder that our Sportsman's Extravaganza will soon be happening at the Richland Center Community Center beginning at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 27th. There will be food, raffles and many door prizes available. The drawing for the 40 acres of hunting land or \$25,000 takes place @ 9:30 p.m. Come and enjoy the evening supporting your parish when you do so.

Spiritual Adoption Program

We, as individuals and as a parish family have the opportunity to participate in a wonderful program to "spiritually adopt" one unknown baby for the next nine months. Each of us can pray for our child that he or she will be carried to term and experience the fullness of life as God intended

For just a moment, picture a young woman who just week discovered that she is seven weeks pregnant. What she may not know is that her baby's heart has been beating for four weeks, it can flex its fingers and toes, suck on his or her thumb and is totally dependent on her. She may not know where to turn. She may be struggling with her fears of being a mother. She may be experiencing pressure and advice from many caring and well-intentioned family members and friends. Our prayers can make a difference in whether this baby will be born safely. Our prayers can also be a form of spiritual support for all parents.

Please take a prayer card placed at one of the entrances and pray the very brief prayer daily for your "adopted child." While this child may remain unknown to us, God knows who the child is. Therefore we ask that you name your child in order to stay focused on the reality that your prayers are helping to keep an actual

unborn child safe.

At the end of the nine-month period we as a parish will celebrate the "birth" of our spiritually adopted babies with a baby shower. In this way we can also help, in a very tangible way, the mother as she brings to term a beautiful gift of life. All gifts collected at the shower will be donated to Door of Hope. pregnancy and Family Care Center in Viroqua and Little Lambs **Clothing Closet in Richland Center** to help mothers in need.
