

From your pastor . . .

This column returns to a partial reproduction of the <u>Catechism on The Real Presence</u> by Servant of God Father John A. Hardon, S.J. The abbreviation (MF) after some of the answers is a reference to the encyclical *Mysterium Fidei* (Mystery of Faith) promulgated by Pope Paul VI on September 3, 1965.

CHRIST OUR LORD IS PRESENT IN THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST BY TRANSUBSTANTIATION

88. How is Christ made present in the Holy Eucharist?

Christ is made present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist in what the Church calls the greatest miracle of its kind. It is nothing less than the change of the whole substance of the bread into His Body, and the whole substance of the wine into His Blood. This unique and truly wonderful change the Catholic Church calls transubstantiation. As result of transubstantiation, the species of bread and wine not only take on a new meaning and a new purpose, they become nothing less than a new reality which we may justly term ontological. (MF 56)

89. What does this ontological change mean?

This means there is an objective change in the reality of what used to be bread and wine. By the words of consecration, they become the Body and Blood of Christ. He becomes present whole and entire; it is physical reality and bodily presence.

90. Can this presence of Christ be perceived by the senses?

No. It can only be perceived by the mind and enlightened by faith. We must believe what we cannot comprehend. Why? Because nothing is impossible to God, (MF 57).

91. How did the Fathers of the Church warn the faithful?

They warn the faithful not to trust in their sense, but in the words of Christ. He has the power to transform, change and transmute the bread and wine into His own Body and Blood, (MF 57).

92. What are the statements of some of these Fathers of the Church?

Saint Cyril of Jerusalem declared: "We have been instructed in these matters and filled with an unshakable faith that which seems to be bread, is not bread, though it tastes like it, but the Body of Christ; and that which seems to be wine, is not wine, though it tastes as such, but is the blood of Christ . . . draw inner strength by receiving this bread as spiritual food and your soul will rejoice, (MF 58).

St. John Chrysostom said: "It is not the power of man which makes what is put before us the Body and Blood of Christ, but the power of Christ Himself who was crucified for us. The priest standing there in the place of Christ says these words, but their power and grace are from God. 'This is my Body,' He says, and these words transform what lies before him.


