

From your pastor . . .

It has been a while since I have written this column. It was nice to take a break but now it is good to be back at my desk. Thank you for your prayers for my safe travel over these past weeks.

A few of you have asked since my return if I was able to get my bottle of sacramental wine for Mass aboard the ship. I did so without any difficulty. I watched my bag get x-rayed, so I know that they saw it, but allowed it to pass through without any questions. I am not certain which saint or saints in heaven intercede for those kinds of matters, but they got the job done. (I suspect Saint Joseph had something to do with it, in that I call on him quite often for a myriad of needs).

My vacation primarily revolved around the transatlantic crossing from Port Canaveral, Florida to Barcelona, Spain. I drove to Orlando from Richland Center, parked my vehicle in a secure lot and took a shuttle bus to the Port. It was a thirteen-day crossing with stops at Bermuda, Ponta Delgado in the Azores Archipelago, Malaga and Valencia, Spain with the final stop in Barcelona. The weather was warm, and the ocean was calm the entire way. The only disappointment was that I was looking forward to the passage through the Strait of Gibraltar and seeing the famous Rock of Gibraltar for the first time. However, we passed through the straits around midnight and a heavy fog had settled in between the land mass of Spain and Africa, so it was obscured from view. Maybe another time.

During the stops at the ports of the Spanish cities I mentioned above, the most memorable was visiting the Cathedral in Valencia. In a special chapel in the Cathedral the Holy Grail is on display. It is claimed to be (with Vatican approval) the chalice that our Lord used with his Apostles at the Last Supper. Also, the day I spent in Barcelona was mostly dedicated to exploring the Church of the Sagrada Familia (Holy Family), which is a massive church in height and circumference that is still under continuous construction that began in 1882. It is an extraordinary structure. After my stay in Barcelona, I flew from there to Lisbon, Portugal and then to Newark, New Jersey and then finally to Orlando, Florida where my vehicle was waiting for me to make the drive back to Wisconsin.

This was my third time crossing the Atlantic Ocean in a ship. For whatever reason I have found the crossings to be one of the most enjoyable and relaxing times that I have experienced during my 68 years. I give thanks to God for the safe passage this last crossing and for the opportunity to again enjoy this magnificent creature (the ocean) that our creator placed here on the earth.

I again thank you for your prayers over these past weeks. If you have been reading the bulletin you know that this next week beginning on Thursday, the 26th and continuing through to Sunday, there will be a display of the Eucharist miracles that have been judged by the Church to be authentic that will be available in the undercroft of our church. Also, during these days, there is a schedule of times for adoration of our Eucharistic Lord in the Church. I hope that many of our parishioners will take the opportunity to learn about the miracles as well as to spend some quiet prayer time before the Blessed Sacrament.






