

From your pastor . . .

Be sure to mark your calendars for next Sunday's pancake breakfast after the two morning Masses (8:30 -12:00 noon), provided by the Knights of Columbus. A free-will offering is appreciated.

This column continues with a partial reproduction of the <u>Catechism on The Real Presence</u> by Servant of God Father John A. Hardon, S.J. The abbreviation (MF) after some of the answers is a reference to the encyclical *Mysterium Fidei* (Mystery of Faith) promulgated by Pope Paul VI on September 3, 1965. These installments from Father Hardon's Catechism are meant to assist in a deeper understanding and appreciation of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist as the Catholic Church in the United States engages in a National Eucharistic Revival.

96. What is Saint Augustine's famous statement on the Real Presence?

According to Saint Augustine: "It was in His flesh that Christ walked among us and it is His flesh that he has given us to eat for our salvation. No one, however, eats of this flesh without having first adored it... and not only do we not sin in thus adoring it, but we would sin if we did not do so."

Notice what Saint Augustine is saying. The Holy Eucharist is the living Flesh and Blood of the Incarnate God. The key word is incarnated. God has been present in the world from the moment He created it. But God entered the world as incarnate at the Annunciation when He took flesh in the womb of His mother Mary. Without the Incarnation, there is no Eucharist, (MF 66).

97. Does the Catholic Church reserve the Blessed Sacrament?

Yes, from the dawn of her history, she has always reserved the Blessed Sacrament with the utmost care. She has exposed the consecrated Hosts to solemn veneration and has carried them in procession to the joy of great crowds of the faithful, (MF) 68.

98. Who is one of the early Fathers of the Church warning the faithful to reverence the Eucharist?

Among others, Saint Hippolytus (d.236) cautions the faithful against desecrating the consecrated Host, which from the beginning was reserved outside of Mass, (MF 68).

99. How solicitous were the early Christians in their reverence for the Holy Eucharist?

From the earliest years we are told they considered themselves guilty of sin if through negligence even a small fragment of the consecrated Host fell to the ground, (MF 69-70).

100. Were there erroneous ideas about the Eucharist in the early Church?

Yes, among other early Fathers of the Church, St. Cyril of Alexandria rejected as folly the opinion of those who claimed that if a part of the Eucharist was left over for the following day, it did not confer sanctification. According to Saint Cyril, "Neither Christ is altered, nor His Holy Body changed, but the force and power and vivifying grace always remain with it." (MF 71).

Today, at the 10:30 Mass those in attendance will witness the first of the three scrutinies that will be administered to our three catechumens over the next two weeks. Please keep catechumens, Kendra Bingham, Dalton Johnson and Christina Koch in your prayers as they prepare for their full initiation into the Catholic Faith with their reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion at the upcoming Easter Vigil.
