

From your pastor . . .

Recently I was asked what is a mortal sin and if there is a list of sins to which one can be referred? I believe I published the list below many years ago. It can serve as an important reference as we begin the Lenten season.

Sin must involve three elements: 1. Knowledge that what is being committed is a sin, 2. The deliberate intention to commit the sin, 3. The matter that constitutes the evil – (mortal sin always contains grave matter). All three elements must be present for there to be culpability (personal responsibility for having sinned.)

What is listed below is the evil that constitutes the grave matter of a particular mortal sin.

Mortal Sins (This is not an exhaustive list)

- Abortion (any formal cooperation in it)
- Adulation of another's grave faults if it makes one an accomplice in another's vices or grave sins
- Adultery
- Agnosticism
- Atheism
- Bestiality
- Blasphemy
- Cheating unless the damage inflicted is so small that one who suffers it cannot reasonably consider it significant
- Defrauding a worker of his wages
- Deliberate failure to go to mass on Holy Days of Obligation unless excused for a serious reason (for example illness or to care for infants) or dispensed by one's pastor
- Divination, magic, sorcery and occult practices
- Divorce, with a refusal to acknowledge the indissolubility of one's sacramental marriage leading to an attempt to marry another person.
- Using drugs unless on strictly therapeutic grounds
- Endangering one's own and others' safety by drunkenness or a love of speed
- Envy (to the level of wishing grave harm to another)
- Euthanasia
- Extortion
- Extreme Anger (at the level of desiring to seriously hurt or kill someone)
- False allegations
- Fornication
- Hatred of a neighbor to the point of deliberately desiring him or her great harm
- Homosexual acts
- Idolatry
- Incest
- Lying (the gravity is measured by "the truth it deforms, the circumstances, the intentions of the one who lies, and the harm suffered by its victims)
- Masturbation (The gravity is measured by conditions of anxiety, force of acquired habit, and/or emotional immaturity)
- Murder and co-operation in murder (except when done in self-defense or defense of others when there is no other way).
- Perjury and False Oaths
- Polygamy
- Pornography
- Prostitution "While it is always gravely sinful to engage in prostitution, the imputability of the offense can be attenuated by destitution, blackmail, or social pressure."
- Rape
- Refusing or withholding a just wage
- Sacrilege the desecration of what is holy
- Scandal (deliberately causing someone to sin gravely)
- Suicide "Grave psychological disturbances, anguish, or grave fear of hardship, suffering, or torture can diminish the responsibility of the one committing suicide."
- Terrorism that threatens, wounds and kills indiscriminately
- Voluntary doubt of the Faith

Unfair wagers and cheating at games unless the damage is unusually light



Lenten Regulations

The Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2. Lenten regulations are as follows:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal.

Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
