From your pastor ...

This weekend, we welcome Father Kurt Apfelbeck as celebrant for the Masses. Father Apfelbeck is familiar to Saint Mary's Parishioners in that he has helped out before. Your pastor is gone this weekend to Green Bay to celebrate his cousin, Matthew Colle's ordination to the priesthood on Saturday and his First Mass, celebrated on Sunday. Matthew is the grand-son of my Aunt Janet Marcks (deceased), who was one of my Father's younger sisters and my Godmother. I enjoy having a first cousin on my Mother's side of the family, Father John Meoska O.S.B. as a brother priest and now I will enjoy having a second-cousin on the Scheckel side of the family as a brother priest as well. While in Green Bay I will be spending a few extra days visiting with family who live in that area of the State.

I wish to continue to introduce to you the Diocesan-wide capital campaign, **Inspired by the Spirit**, that will be conducted in our parish beginning this August, concluding on November 18, 2022. The campaign has already begun in the Diocese with 20 parishes that are serving as "pilot parishes." These parishes began the campaign beginning in March and are bringing it to a conclusion in July.

The campaign is being conducted with the help of Lynch Development Associated, Inc. (LDA), hired by Bishop Callahan. LDA will be providing a person from their organization to be the campaign director for our parish. This person is to assist the parishioners who volunteer to be involved in the campaign to be properly prepared through training sessions.

I will now present in a question-and-answer format that has been published by LDA. In the last column the question was asked "How does running this campaign benefit my parish? If you did not see the answer, you can look it up on the parish website by opening the archive to last week's bulletin.

2. Can you explain the Campaign sharing formula?

The designed sharing formula for this Campaign effort is 65% for the parish and 35% for Diocesan and Diocesan Annual Appeal needs up to 100% of the goal.

65% of the funds raised will be returned to the parish for its own identified needs.

35% of the funds raised will be used for the Diocesan portion of the case statement.

Any funds raised over the parish's assigned goal will be shared 80% to the parish case and 20% to the Diocesan case.

Parishes will be responsible to fulfill their 2022-2023 Diocesan Annual Appeal goal with the first monies raised.

3. What are the Diocesan Case Items (35% of goal)?

In short;

The 2022-2023 Diocesan Annual Appeal – 15% or \$6 million

The infrastructure and start-up costs for the Catholic Foundation of West Central Wisconsin – 7.5% or \$3 million

Restoration, repairs, and updates for the Holy Cross Diocesan Center - 12.5% or \$5 million.

 \sim Restore the Christ the King Chapel stained-glass windows

~ Upgrade security, HVAC< electrical, WIFI

~ Update residential areas for Active and Senior Priests

~ Provide a safe, cost-effective, comfortable, and prayer environment for all who live , work or visit the Center.

4. I'm not sure we will be able to raise that amount. Isn't this a bad time to ask for money?

Actually, this is an excellent time to invite people to support this Campaign effort.

Individual charitable giving grew over 2.2% in 2020 over 2019 despite the challenges we experienced this past year. Overall, giving to religion made up for over 7% of all charitable gifts made in 2020 and made up the largest individual sector of giving according to Giving USA. While this may seem counterintuitive to the experiences we had recently, in addition, the personal saving rate of individuals and families skyrocketed this year providing additional resources for them to support charitable causes.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.


