

Display of the Eucharistic Miracles (undercroft)

From your pastor. . .

In this column we continue with the presentation by Father John A. Hardon, S.J., founder of the Marian Catechist Apostolate on the Holy Eucharist as it appears in his <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u> (printed in *italics*). Father Hardon refers often to the encyclical letter *Mysterium Fidei*, <u>The Mystery of Faith</u>, (MF), written by Pope Saint Paul VI. The catechesis in this column on the Holy Eucharist is meant to correspond with the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout the Dioceses in the United States.

35. Why is the Eucharist called the mystery of faith?

To believe in the Real Presence implies faith in all the mysteries of Christianity. We must believe that God became man, that the God-man lived on earth in visible form as true man for thirty-three years; that at the Last Supper He changed bread and wine into His living Body and Blood; that on the same Holy Thursday He instituted the priesthood mainly to continue remaining on earth as true God and true man. Any doubt on any of these cardinal mysteries undermines faith in the Real Presence.

36. What is a strong confirmation of our faith in the Real Presence?

It is he unqualified teaching of the Church's authority, finally vested in the Bishop of Rome, that the Eucharist is Jesus Christ now on earth no less than He is now in heaven. From the earliest Fathers of the Church, there has been no ambiguity about this faith. That is one of the tragic consequences of breaking with the Church's magisterium or teaching authority. What happens? Left to itself, the human mind goes wild in its interpretation of God's revealed words as found in both Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. Thus, Martin Luther, who had been a priest for fifteen years, broke with Catholic Church on October 31,1517. By the year 1600 there were over two hundred Protestant interpretations of Christ's words, "this is my body . . . this is my blood," (MF 21).

37. How important is the language we use in speaking about the Holy Eucharist?

It is crucially important. As history has shown, errors of faith are cleverly disguised in ambiguous language. The result is people can read into words whatever meaning they want, (MF 22).

38. What is St. Augustine's warning in this matter?

He says, "The philosophers speak freely without fear of offending religious listeners on subjects quite difficult to understand. We, on the other hand, must speak according to a fixed norm, lest the lack of restraint in our speech result in some impious opinion even about the things signified by the words themselves." St. Augustine is telling us to watch our language. In matters of faith, it is critically important to know the right words which express God's revealed truth. Otherwise, our minds become confused and those who listen to us will be deprived of the grace that only truth can provide, (MF 23).

39. How does Pope Paul VI re-emphasize St. Augustine's warning?

Paul VI knew that a variety of erroneous theories had arisen regarding the mystery of the Holy Eucharist. He also saw that these errors were couched in a radical change of language to explain the Holy Eucharist. He is telling us that the words which the Church has been using over the centuries to identify and explain the Blessed Sacrament must remain constant. This consistency of language is a reflection of the Church's continuity of faith. We are human beings who use human language to express our thoughts and judgments. Our thought and judgments on the Hoy Eucharist dare not be changed so as to dilute or deny what the Church has been teaching uninterruptedly over the centuries. We should immediately suspect any writer or speaker who presumes to change the Church's official language about the Holy Eucharist as sacrifice, communion and Real Presence, (MF 24).

I hope that you have had an opportunity to begin reading Bishop Robert Barron's book entitled, <u>This Is My Body</u> that has been made available on the tables near the entrances/exits of the church. Let us continue to ask the Lord of the Harvest to bless our fields with sufficient moisture so that we may have an abundant harvest in the weeks and months to come.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.






