



#### SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### From your pastor $\dots$

I wish to thank the parishioners who have been coming to Sunday and the weekday Masses for your willingness to wipe the pews with the sanitizing wipes before you leave the church. It is a small but significant act of charity toward your neighbor who will next sit in that pew. This system of everyone pitching in to keep the church sanitized seems to be working very well. A related matter to this cleansing after Mass is the conversation and brief fellowship that is taking place as the pews are being cleansed. One of the stipulations for opening of the Churches for public Masses was that we are to discourage people from gathering in groups in the Church or in the parking lot. This is the reason that Deacon Tully and I do not process out of the church and greet people after Mass. In all likelihood if we were to stand outside the main door of the church as we have done in the past it would create a bottle neck that would bring people in closer physical proximity than what is recommended. This is why we exit from the Mass via the sacristy door. It does appear that while people are sanitizing the pews they are conversing with one another at a safe distance and with sanitizing wipes in their hands. It seems to be a good way of proceeding on a number of levels.

I too want to acknowledge the good work of our custodian Patrick Schwingle, our assistant cleaner of the church and rectory, Silvia Osario, our parish administrative assistant, Cheryl Blankenship as well as numerous volunteers, particularly Gordon Moore, and JoAnn Hall who have provided sanitizing cleansing of the church during the week. The wooden stands that hold the sanitizing dispensers that are in the aisle and at the entry ways were constructed by Gordon and Patrick.

I have been asked numerous times if we will be requiring the wearing of masks during the Mass in the future. As of now, this is a personal choice and not something that is mandatory. You may notice that I use a mask in the distribution of Holy Communion. This is to provide an option to anyone attending Mass who feels strongly about this matter and who may not otherwise receive Holy Communion. If this is something that you feel strongly about, it is certainly permissible to change the line you are in when coming forward to receive our Lord in Holy Communion. If in the future it is mandated by the competent authorities that masks must be worn in all public places, we will comply with the mandate. I am well aware that there are strong feelings on the part of many people when they are mandated to do something. If there is a mandate regarding masks, we will put up the signage as well as make masks available for those who do not have their own, however we will not ask people to leave the church if they choose not to wear a mask.

We have a committee that is working to provide the protocols for opening the school for person-to- person instruction. It is our intention to open the school on September 1<sup>st</sup>. There is ongoing communication taking place between parents and the school administration at this time so that all of this can transpire I am certain that our principal, Stacia Kohlstedt would appreciate a special remembrance in your prayers in that she is providing the leadership in this matter.

This past week we received the final installment of \$300 for the Diocesan Annual Appeal overage. In total, the parish received overage payments of \$17,317.00, all of which has been deposited to our Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund. With this addition, our Perpetual Fund balance is \$88,565.49. This Fund is being directed by the Diocese of La Crosse which uses BMO Bank/Investments. We are able to receive a quarterly distribution from the fund, however we having been reinvesting rather than spending the distribution. Thank you to all who responded generously to the Diocesan Annual Appeal.

Finally, I ask that you consider buying or selling the Parish Festival drawing tickets that were sent to your home a couple of weeks ago. A successful drawing will help us make up for a decrease in our offertory giving that we have experienced over these past months. Thank you for whatever you are able to do.

I will be taking the upcoming week days for some vacation from the parish. I will be close by and able to respond to any pastoral emergencies. Stay healthy and close to our Lord during these summer days.





### Scrip News


