

From your pastor ...

A special thank you to those men, Randy Birkholz, Mark Frawley, Alan Eggers and Patrick Schwingle who laid sod this last week between the school and the rectory garage as well as a small amount next to the rectory near the westside entrance. Having nice, lush grass for our students to play on rather than dirt should help our school parents' laundry loads.

We will continue with the presentation by Father John A. Hardon, S.J., founder of the Marian Catechist Apostolate on the Holy Eucharist as it appears in his <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u>. Father Hardon refers often to the encyclical letter *Mysterium Fidei*, <u>The Mystery of Faith</u>, (MF), written by Pope Saint Paul VI. The catechesis in this column on the Holy Eucharist is meant to correspond with the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout the Dioceses in the United States.

40. How important are the Church's formulas in teaching the doctrine of the Holy Eucharist?

We may legitimately speak of development of doctrine, where the Church grows in her grasp and clarity of understanding revealed truth. But this development can never be contrary to or inconsistent with the Church's teaching from the first century of the Christian era to the present. The human mind is limitless in its conceiving of new ideas. But these new ideas may never contradict the original deposit of faith which Christ gave us, (MF 25).

41. Can we grow in our clarity and accuracy of understanding the mystery of the Eucharist?

Yes, we can and should grow in our depth and clarity of understanding of God's revealed truth, here the revealed truth of the Holy Eucharist. But all of this presumes that the objective truth revealed by God and taught by the Church remains unchanged. The change, therefore, is not in the objective truth of what God has revealed. It is rather the subjective development of our own deeper and clearer and more accurate grasp of what has been once and for all times revealed by God, (MF 26).

THE MYSTERY OF THE EUCHARIST IS VERIFIED IN THE SACRIFICE OF THE MASS

42. What is Pope Paul VI's intention?

He intends to review with the faithful the Church's unanimous and continuous teaching about the mystery of the Eucharist. To be kept in mind is that a mystery of faith is a revealed truth that cannot be rationally conceived before revelation, nor rationally comprehended after revelation. Nevertheless, we are to grow in our understanding of mysteries which, in the last analysis, are beyond our human capacity to fully comprehend, (MF 27).

43. How is the Sacrifice of the Mass related to the sacrifice on Calvary?

At Mass the sacrifice of the cross, once offered on Calvary, is remarkably re-presented and constantly recalled and its saving power exerted for the forgiveness of those sins which we daily commit, (MF 28).

Please keep before our Lord the petition for sufficient rainfall for our crops and countryside. "Ask, seek, knock and it shall be granted to you." Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.




