

From your pastor ...

We are very close to the start of the **Inspired by the Spirit** campaign that will be taking place in our parish over the next three months. All parishioners who give annually a reported amount of \$100 or more to the parish are included in an invitation that has been sent this week to attend one of two scheduled receptions to learn about the campaign. Those two meetings are scheduled for Tuesday, September 6th and September 13th at 7:00 p.m. in the undercroft of the church. Please follow the instructions as they appear in the invitation, particularly in regard to the need for an RSVP so that we can plan for hospitality.

This column will be the final one that repeats what I have written earlier this summer regarding the **Inspired by the Spirit** campaign. I have engaged in this repetition in order to reach as many parishioners as possible. This is challenging in the summer months when many of you take vacations and are gone from the parish for a time. Hopefully by repeating, you have come in contact with some of what I have written about the campaign.

What follows in this column is a repeat of a list of the projects that have been accomplished in our parish over the past six years.

In 2016, new windows were installed in the rectory for the cost of \$11,956.

In 2016, two new boilers were installed in the Church and two new ones installed in school for the cost of \$144,500.

One of the replaced boilers in the school was moved to the Commons to replace the boiler in that building that was no longer functioning for a cost \$6,000.

In 2017, air handlers/air conditioners were installed in school classrooms for a cost of \$210,000. (The 7th and 8th grade as well as the 3- and 4-year-old kindergarten rooms are cooled and heated by the geo-thermal system that was put in place during the addition to the school in 2013.)

In 2017, the road that runs through our parish cemetery was repaved for the cost of \$7,970.

In 2020, the asbestos tile and carpeting in the church sanctuary was removed and replaced with marble tile for the cost of \$21,710.

In 2021, an air purification system was installed in school classrooms to purify the air due to COVID for the cost of \$22,000.

In 2021, a new marble ambo that matches the existing altar in the Church was purchased for \$13,000.

This past month (July, 2022) the flat roofs on our parish buildings were all replaced with raised roofs, completed at the cost of \$38,126.

These projects have been carried out and paid for without asking the parishioners to contribute over and above their regular weekly/monthly tithe. This is primarily due to the successful fundraising that takes place in our parish.

However, to carry out the needed renovation of the pews and nave of the church, with a projected cost of \$305,00, we are in need of all the parishioners of Saint Mary's to participate generously in the **Inspired by the Spirit Campaign**.


Please plan to respond to the invitation you will soon receive to come and learn more about the campaign and the projects that will be funded by it.


