From your pastor . . .

In place of the usual homily, this Sunday there was a presentation concerning the **Inspired by the Spirit** capital campaign that has, is or will be taking place in every parish in the Diocese of La Crosse.

Some of the Saint Mary parishioners have had personal meetings with me and others have met in a larger group at the two receptions that took place in the undercroft of the church the past two weeks. I am very pleased to report that from those parishioners there was a wonderful and generous response. As of September 9th, through gifts and pledges 50.36% of the total amount (\$480,000) assigned to our parish has been raised. I take this occasion to express my gratitude to those who have responded in this generous way bringing a wonderful beginning to the campaign.

If you were not part of the above-mentioned parishioners, you will be receiving in the mail a large white envelope with a 'Saint Mary of the Assumption Parish' return address. In this packet will be all the information that I believe you will need to understand the campaign and what it will accomplish for the Diocese of La Crosse and at our parish of Saint Mary's. This mailing will include a campaign donation/pledge card which will have attached to it a personal note from your pastor asking for your consideration of a specific requested amount. This amount, which includes my hand-written signature was determined by me alone. It is a confidential matter between each parishioner and their pastor. Whatever amount you give will be appreciated and used well. Along with the donation/pledge card is an addressed envelope to the **Inspired by the Spirit** campaign. Please send your donation/pledge in that envelope.

In future columns, I will speak specifically of the plans for the use of the monies being raised in the campaign for the renovation of the nave, (that part of the church where the aisles and pews are located).

I take this occasion to express gratitude to all the catechists in our parish who hand on the Catholic Faith by teaching in the Catholic School and the Religious Education program. Our religious education program started with its first class this Sunday.

Finally, I wish to take this occasion to express thanks to all who were involved in our Parish Festival this Saturday. Thank you to all who made contributions to the festival in terms time, talent and treasure. This year the Home and School Association (HASA) provided much of the leadership for the festival. HASA will receive the receipts for the profits made from the various activities on the grounds. The receipts from the festival drawing will be used in the parish. A special thank you to the Knights of Columbus for providing the delicious grilled food and the PCCW members for providing the bake sale goods.

For the next two Sundays, Father Kurt Apfelbeck, who works in the Chancery Office at the Diocese will be here to celebrate the Masses while I take my annual vacation. I will be engaged in a construction project at my farm in Crawford County and will be taking some short trips with my motorcycle. If a priest is needed, please contact the rectory and one of the local priests will be contacted. Thank you.

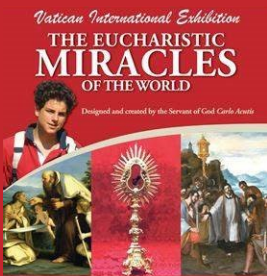
