

#### From the Deacon:

The Peace of Christ be with you! I'd like to take you back in time, all the way back to last Sunday. If you recall the Gospel, Jesus overheard "The 12", his apostles, discussing who among them was the greatest, the most important. Jesus seized this opportunity to teach the apostles the truth about leadership. And that truth is that leadership is not about the accumulation of power. Rather, it is about service. Jesus introduced the concept of "Servant Leadership". To briefly summarize Jesus's concept of servant leadership, he taught his disciples, and us, that to be a leader, one must place the good and well-being of others before oneself. It means to set aside your own desires in order to first care for the needs of others with dignity and respect.

I'm taking this little trip in the Way Back Machine (Anybody remember Mr. Peabody and Sherman?) because I want to call your attention to a group of servant leaders among us. While there are many servant leaders among us, I am referring specifically to our catechists, those men and women who devote their time and talent, and often their treasure, to living out Jesus's Great Commandment to go and make disciples of all nations. The third week of September, last Sunday, is designated each year by the bishops of the Catholic Church in the United States as **Catechetical Sunday**. It's a day to recognize, celebrate and ask for God's blessings for those who pass on the faith to our children in the classroom – be they our beloved teachers at St. Mary School or our most blessed parishioners who respond to God's call to share the faith through our spiritual formation program, Religious Education.

Our teachers are indeed holy and blessed for the service and sacrifice they give to our children. There is another group of servant leaders who bear an even greater responsibility to our children. We call these servant leaders parents. The call to carry the Word of God, to hand on the faith to the next generation does not fall solely on the shoulders of our classroom catechists. It is the responsibility of all parents – and, yes, grandparents, too. The Church teaches that the parents are the first and primary educators of their children. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) makes this clear.

The role of the parent in education is of such importance that it is almost impossible to provide an adequate substitute. The right and duty of parents to educate their children are primordial and inalienable (CCC 2221).

I would point out that the Church is speaking of <u>all</u> education: spiritual, scholastic, interpersonal, life skills, etc. And the terms "first" and "primary" are not synonymous. Parents are first educators of their children because the responsibility begins at birth. They are primary educators, a responsibility that no one can usurp, as stated by the Catechism above.

So let us remember to pray often for our catechists – our classroom catechists and our parental catechists. Offer prayers of thanksgiving for their selfless devotion and ask the Holy Spirit to fill them with wisdom and courage to carry out God's call to spread the Good News of the Gospel.


