

From your pastor ...

The past issue (Thursday, January 4, 2024) of the Richland Observer published the obituary of Sister Mary Jane (Georgene) Cournoyer, O.S. B. (Order of Saint Benedict). She, along with other Benedictine Sisters had served our parish by staffing the Catholic School. When Sister Mary Jane was here at Saint Mary's she served as the principal as well as the superior to those sisters assigned with her. I must confess that I never met Sister Mary Jane, however I suspect there are some of our older parishioners who may remember her. Sister Mary Jane was born February 22, 1925, and died on Christmas Day, December 25, 2023. She was buried on Thursday, January 4, 2024, at Saint Benedicts Monastery, Saint Joseph, Minnesota. She served as a vowed religious sister for over 73 years. May she be granted a generous reward for all her good work, especially what was accomplished with God's help here at Saint Mary's Parish. May she rest in peace.


With the new year, the Church throughout the United States begins it third and final year of Eucharistic Revival. This year includes a national procession that will come from four different directions, the north, south, east, and west, converging near the center of the nation at Indianapolis, Indiana. Each of these four routes will begin on May 18, 2024, and arrive in Indianapolis on July 16, 2024. The route that will involve the Diocese of La Crosse is named "the Marian Route." It will begin at the mouth of the Mississippi River, at Lake Itasca, Minnesota, travel south coming through Rochester and Winona, Mn. It will connect with the Diocese of La Crosse at the Cass Street Bridge that crosses the Mississippi River from west to east. Bishop Robert Barron, of the Winona, Diocese, will pass the monstrance containing the Holy Eucharist to Bishop William Callahan, the Bishop of La Crosse in the middle of the Cass Street Bridge, on June 7, 2024. The procession will then continue to the Cathedral of Saint Joseph the Workman for the 12:10 p.m. Mass. Following the Mass, the seminarians of the diocese will lead the procession to Aquinas High School, where a youth rally will take place. On Saturday, the Monstrance with the Holy Eucharist will remain in La Crosse with programs that will involve students from UW -L and Viterbo University. By Sunday the procession, following the Marian route, will have reached Sparta, where the Sunday Mass will be celebrated at Saint Patrick's Parish. The focus during the time in Sparta will be on the Hispanic presence and ministry in the Diocese. On Sunday afternoon the procession will leave Sparta and make its way to Wisconsin Rapids to SS. Peter and Paul Parish. The evening will involve a Holy Hour that will focus on the ministry of Deacons in our Diocese. The next morning following Mass, the procession will continue to Marshfield to Saint John the Baptist Parish. Events there are still being considered. The procession then travels on to Wausau. Arriving there, they will be met by the Catholic Hmong community, which will host an event at Mary, Mother of Good Help Parish. Other activities will be planned among the Wausau parishes. In the morning, the procession will depart from the Diocese of La Crosse and pass over into the Green Bay Diocese.

As you can ascertain from the above schedule (which is subject to change) much thought and planning is being put into the Eucharistic procession as it passes through the Diocese of La Crosse. Parishioners from Saint Mary's, particularly families, should begin to plan for some kind of involvement. There will be more information forthcoming over the months ahead. 
