From your pastor . . .

The day has arrived when we are required to leave the confines of our parish church so that it can be cleaned, painted, and renovated. This begins this Monday, January 16th. It will be approximately eight weeks (could be less or more) before completion. In the meantime, we will gather in the school gymnasium for the Sunday (Saturday Vigil) masses as well as for the one Mass a week (Friday) for the school students. The Masses for Sunday will be at the usual times and the Mass for the school Students on Friday will be at 2:15 p.m. The entire parish is welcomed to attend this Friday Mass. Mass during the other weekdays will be the usual time (8:15 a.m.) to be celebrated in the Commons (Convent) chapel. We will continue to have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursday for one hour after the Mass.

A funeral Mass can be celebrated in the gymnasium. If there is a desire for the funeral Mass to be celebrated in a Church, I would approach Father Nathan, pastor at Saint Mary's Keyesville to see if it would be possible to hold the Funeral Mass there.

It will be important to follow the signage that will be apparent on the grounds indicating which doorways to use to enter either the gymnasium or the school. There will be the possibility for those who have physical challenges and use a walker or some other help to enter the gymnasium from the south end of the parking lot/playground. That doorway leads directly into the gymnasium. All others are being asked to go around the south end of the gymnasium and one hundred feet east on the sidewalk to the pre-school/kindergarten school entrance. The signage after you enter the school will lead you to the gymnasium.

The reason for routing parishioners through the preschool entrance is that if the door that allows one to enter directly into the gymnasium is opened too many times letting in cold air from the outside it will require the boilers to run which makes the fans run in the gymnasium until the temperature gets returned to its thermostat setting. The fans in the gymnasium are big and noisy, making it almost impossible for the priest, deacon, and reader to be heard,

The Knights of Columbus have been asked to provide guidance for the three Masses for the first couple of weeks.

When Mass is concluded, you can leave through the gymnasium door that leads directly into the parking lot/playground. The fans should have shut off by the time the second Mass on Sunday begins.

Servers should report to the <u>priest/deacon sacristy in the Church.</u> The cassocks and surplices will have been placed there. The priest and deacon will vest there as well and the procession to begin the Mass will begin from there.

Confessions will be made available in a room near the kindergarten room as you come into the school through the door mentioned above. There will be signage indicating the room. I hope to have two possibilities – anonymous and face-to-face.

There are probably other things that I haven't covered that will need to be explained, but we will attempt to cover them through verbal announcements. As I have said before, there will be inconvenience in the days ahead, but through cooperation and patience, we will do just fine.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
