From your pastor ...

Next Sunday, April 23 at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, First Holy Communion will be celebrated. Practice will take place on Saturday, April 22 at 10:00 a.m. At least one parent should attend with the first communicant.

This Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The gospel for this day is always from Saint John as he describes the appearance of the resurrected Lord in the upper room (the same room where the Last Supper had been eaten). In that encounter, Saint John describes the risen Christ "breathing" on the apostles and then making the declaration: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Here we have in very clear terms the institution of the Sacrament of Penance. Two things should be noted. 1. Jesus breathing on the apostles harkens back to the second chapter of Genesis when God breathes his Spirit into the first man. The first human being is spiritually endowed from the breath of God. Now in the evening on the first day of Christ's resurrection he endows his apostles with his Spirit so they can re-create men and women through forgiveness of their sins. 2. The risen Christ indicates how the apostles' authority to forgive sins is to be accomplished. It requires making a judgment concerning the contrition necessary on the part of the penitent.

There are many, including some Catholics who question why sins must be confessed to a priest. It is because of this passage from Saint John's gospel that indicates some kind of conversation that involves an admission of sin needs to happen to be able discern whether to forgive or to retain the sins confessed. Christ reveals that His Divine Mercy is dispensed according to a particular form that involves a confession of sins to a person with apostolic authority to retain or loose.

The Sacrament of Penance is one of the most beautiful and consoling sacraments, yet many Catholics for whatever the reason dismiss it's importance. When something essential for salvation such as the Sacrament of Penance is set aside, it should not surprise us that our Lord will send a message from above to get our attention. Sometimes his Blessed Mother, Mary, delivers a particular message while at other times he may choose a particular person here on earth.

He did this in the 1930's, when he chose a simple nun by the name, Sister Faustina Kolwalski (now Saint Faustina) living in a secluded convent in Krakow, Poland to become his "secretary of Divine Mercy." She wrote a rather long diary that was dictated to her through interlocutions by Jesus himself. The message of Divine Mercy given to Saint Faustina was a grace that God has given to his Church and to the entire world concerning the importance of receiving God's mercy as well the importance of engaging in daily acts of mercy toward our neighbor. Carrying out works of mercy is to be the distinguishing mark of Christian identity.

The traditional works of mercy are of two kinds, corporeal and spiritual.

The seven corporal works of mercy are: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned and bury the dead.

The seven spiritual works of mercy are: counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offenses, bear wrongs patiently and pray for the living and the dead.

Hopefully we will use the abundant graces that come to our lives during this holy season of Easter to engage in works of mercy, both corporeal and spiritual as well to allow these graces to lead us to the throne of mercy found in the confessional.
