

From your pastor . . .

As you have already witnessed at Mass, I am back after having been away for three Sundays for some vacation. I used my time away for a brief trip to northern Wisconsin but then used most of my time at the farm in Crawford County where I grew up. I have a cabin that I had built in 2003 by the Amish. I decided to put an addition on the cabin (14 X40 feet) and used the vacation days to assist a local carpenter who is heading up the work. At this point the shell is completed and the doors and windows have been installed. The outside log façade will be installed as well as the interior floor, ceiling, walls, and the final electrical work. Still a work in progress but coming along very well. I did some bow hunting for whitetail deer, but no luck in seeing anything close enough to shoot.

When I celebrated the Mass on the 18th of September, before my leaving for vacation, I announced that a mailing from the rectory (large white envelope) that included a colored brochure describing the capital campaign, **Inspired by the Spirit** had been sent into your homes. Included in the mailing was a pledge/donation card that served as the instrument for making a financial response. At that time, I reported that \$241,440 or 50.3% of the goal of \$480,000 had been received through gifts and pledges.

As of the day that I am writing this column, (Tuesday, October 18th), I can report that \$400,487 or 83.4% of the total goal has been gifted and/or pledged. This amount has come from 72 parishioners which constitutes 29% of those parishioners (248) who give \$50 or more annually for parish support.

This is a very generous response from our parish. Thank you. In the days to come, I wish to encourage that the remaining 71% of parishioners will also respond. We are hoping to bring the active part of the campaign to a conclusion by Thanksgiving. Gifts and pledges will be accepted after Thanksgiving, however there will be no more mailings to your home and my announcements in this column and at the end of Mass will lessen significantly.

At this time, I can confidently ascertain that the campaign has raised and will continue to raise enough funds to sign the various contracts for the renovation of the nave of the Church. Having the support of the majority, if not all parishioners is very important for this improvement of our parish church. This is your spiritual home where you come to be nourished by God's Word and Sacraments. This is the place where you and your family members were perhaps baptized, received your First Holy Communion and First Penance, were confirmed, and celebrated the Sacrament of Marriage. Also, Saint Mary's may have been the church where a family member's Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated and where your own will be celebrated. Just as your own family home at times needs to be repaired and renovated, so to does your spiritual home.

If it is only a modest or small amount that you can give, please do so. Your generosity is desired and needed. Whatever you give will be used well and wisely. By Lent, God willing you will be worshiping in a more beautiful church, made so through the work that by then will have been completed. I would think that you would want to have the good feeling of knowing that you made a sacrificial gift through the campaign that brought about the good changes that you and others will be experiencing and observing.

I take this opportunity to express my gratitude to all who have made contributions thus far through the campaign. Because of your generosity, we will be setting into motion over the next weeks the renovation that appears in the campaign brochure and that appears on the renderings near the entrances to the church. While there will be some inconvenience during the time of renovation, in terms of having to worship either in the gymnasium or undercroft, it will be an exciting time for us all.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.




