From your pastor...

If you are looking for a small part-time job and one which will help your parish, the position for cleaning the church is available. It involves 4-6 hours a week and will pay \$13.50 per hour. If you are interested, please consult the job description that appears else where in this bulletin. Contact the rectory if interested. (During the renovation of the church the cleaning will not be necessary during the time the work is being done.)

This last point leads into some not so good news regarding the renovation, in that I found out this week that the work will not be done by the time Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd. The culprit in extending the length of the work will be the pews. Originally, I was told it would take approximately 3 weeks after they were removed. The timeline now is 8 weeks, plus four to six days that it will take to remove and replace them. What I believe we can anticipate is that the renovations will be done by Holy Week.

Also, after considering the variables that are involved in a parish that doesn't have its church available for eight weeks, it has been decided that Sunday Masses and the school Masses will be held in the gymnasium of the school. Initially, we though the undercroft would work. However, in the event of funeral, the carrying of the casket (it would not fit in the elevator) down the stairs to the undercroft would very difficult and possibly dangerous. The gymnasium will work much better if there were to be a funeral. With the timeline being increased, the possibility of a funeral increases as well.

There will be various inconveniences during the time of renovation, but with patience and perseverance we will make it through and in the end when the renovation is concluded I hope that all of you will agree that it was worth the inconvenience.

If you have not yet made a contribution to the **Inspired by the Spirit Capital** campaign, which is being used to finance the renovation, please do so in the coming weeks. We would like to bring the campaign to a conclusion by Thanksgiving. Obviously, anyone who wishes to make a donation and/or pledge after that time will not be discouraged from doing so.

Let us remember to pray for the newly elected officials in our state and throughout our nation. Hopefully, our nation will experience greater harmony and trust among her citizens in the time ahead.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.


