From your pastor . . .

The renovation has begun. The crew that will be refinishing the pews were here bright and early on Monday and had the pews taken apart and loaded for transport by Wednesday. This coming Monday, a different crew that engages in asbestos abatement will be at the Church removing the floor tile. This will take a couple of days to complete. It is important that no one attempt to enter the church while the abatement work is being done. The undercroft is available for use during this time and the priest sacristy can and is being used for Mass preparation. The servers who come to serve the Mass can put on their servers' garb in the priest's sacristy. We have moved the cassocks and surplices to that room.

Please include in your daily prayer of petition that all will go as planned with the renovation and that there will be no injuries to any of the workers. This will be especially important as the painting is done and the workers use scaffolding for the job at hand.

The Bishops of the United States have launched an initiative called the National Eucharistic Revival. The Eucharistic revival has the stated mission to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. All dioceses in the United States are expected to participate in this three year initiative to increase Eucharistic devotion among the faithful and spread the Gospel message to those who have not yet received it or who at one time received it but have seemingly forgotten it.

This Eucharistic revival comes on the heels of the worldwide synodal process requested by Pope Francis as well as by Bishop Callahan (who was following the directives of the Holy Father). You may remember we had a gathering of parishioners on Saturday, February 5, 2022 to provide feedback to the Holy Father by responding to a number of questions that were asked.

The Eucharistic revival will be integral to helping the Church Universal to put on an apostolic mindset by calling us to a more personal and intimate relationship with God. It will also be a means by which the Church will be able to build upon what the Holy Spirit inspired the members of our parish to respond with, through their various insights during the gathering in February last.

In future columns I will be writing more about this revival and how the parish will become involved.

I will conclude with what was recently shared in the Chancery bulletin of the Diocese of La Crosse in relation to the Eucharistic Revival. It is titled: Jesus is present in the Holy Eucharist and appears in *italics*.

When we look at the consecrated Host at Mass, our eyes see only bread, but the reality is we are looking at Jesus truly present. Jesus, grant me the grace to believe this truth, that though "hidden," You are truly present in Holy Communion. It is important to remember that what we are not able to see with our eyes we grasp by choosing to believe – with faith's consent.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
