

From your pastor ...

Congratulations are to be extended to two of our parishioners, Susan Tully and Candace McGrath, who were chosen respectively to the position of President of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women and Vice-President of the same Council. This means that over the next six years, a Saint Mary's Parishioner will be serving the Diocesan Catholic Women in a very important leadership position. As I mentioned briefly following the second collection that was taken up last Sunday for the Parish Council of Catholic Women, the work of our parish ladies is of great importance and on behalf of the entire parish, I thank them for all they have done and continue to do for our parish. While parishioners are not able to see the new cloth that covers the top of the altar (also known as the 'Mesa,') the PCCW provided this new appointment for the celebration of the Mass. Also, the members of the PCCW carry out a very important ministry to the families of our parish at the time of a death of loved one by providing a funeral luncheon for the family members as well as all who come to pray at the funeral. Having this available in our parish is a great comfort during what can often be a difficult time. Also, when we have a fundraiser such as the Sportsman's Extravaganza and the bake sale at the Parish Festival, the members of the PCCW are generous in sharing their time and talent. Thank you, ladies, for all the good that you do for our Lord through the service you give to his flock here at Saint Mary's Parish.

You may recall a column that I wrote in the bulletin for the weekend of March 11-12, 2022. In that column, I shared that I and a group of parishioners from my former parish in La Crosse, Saint James had traveled to Zapovozhye, Ukraine in 2010 with the Chalice of Mercy ministry to repair the Saint Michael the Archangel Hospice. We stayed for a week with Bishop Jon Sobolio at his Cathedral rectory. I bring this up again due to the sad and frightening news that was reported this past Tuesday, April 26th, that the Russian army has attacked the largest nuclear plant in Ukraine that is in Zapovazhye. Prior to this date, no attacks had been made on Zapovozhye (something in which I have taken a personal interest), however now those attacks have begun. I recall several of the parishioners at the Cathedral of Merciful, God the Father, who helped with the remodeling and repairing of the hospice and with whom we shared lunch daily. I do not have any updates as to what is transpiring in the city except for what I read in the news. I am convicted to redouble my prayers for the safety and well being of the Ukrainian people, particularly those in Zapovozhke.

Please join with me in praying for an end to the warfare and for peace in that region of Europe.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
