From your pastor . . .

We give thanks to God that the four parishioners from our parish who made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land returned safely home this past Monday. This includes our Parish administrative assistant, Cheryl Blankenship. Parish office hours and timely responses to your needs and requests will now return to normal.

The renovation of the Church is moving along on schedule. The ceiling has been cleaned and refinished and it is expected that the painting of the Church will be completed this Friday, February 10th. This present week will involve the laying of the new tile in the nave. The pews are presently being refinished in Waupaca, WI. will be shipped back here, where they will be put together again and placed back in the nave. I am hoping that we will return to our church for Sunday Mass no later than Sunday, March 26th.

I have mentioned in the past few columns about the Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout the universal Church, in all the Diocese of the United States and in our own Diocese. Pastors of our Diocesan parishes are being asked to promote in various ways a deeper understanding of the reality of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. To that end, I have decided to share in this column excerpts from the book, <u>Divine Love Made Flesh</u>: The Holy Eucharist as the Sacrament of Charity, written by our parish son, Raymond Cardinal Burke.

Cardinal Burke presents in his book a commentary on two papal documents: <u>Ecclesia de Eucharistia</u> (The Church of the Eucharist) written by Pope Saint Paul II and <u>Sacramentum Caritas</u> (The Sacrament of Charity) written by Pope Benedict XVI. The latter document was initially proposed by Pope Saint John Paul II, however he died before it could be written. His successor, Pope Benedict proceeded to write it, fulfilling the desire and intention of John Paul II.

In his book, Cardinal Burke comments first on <u>Ecclesia de Eucharistia</u> and then on Sacramentum Caritas. Before sharing parts of Cardinal Burke's book in these forthcoming columns, to assist those parishioners who don't know that much about Cardinal Burke or have never met him, I will reproduce the short biography that appears on the jacket cover of his above mentioned book.

"Raymond Leo Cardinal Burke. Born in 1948 in Richland Center, Wisconsin. Raymond Leo Burke attended seminary in La Crosse, Washington, D.C., and Rome, where he was ordained a priest by Pope Paul VI in 1975. Ordained a bishop in 1995 by Saint Pope John Paul II, he served for almost nine years as Bishop of La Crosse, where he founded the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, and over four years as Archbishop of St. Louis. Since 2008, he has served as Prefect of the Supreme Tribunal of the Apostolic Signatura in Rome. He was named a cardinal in 2010 by Pope Benedict XVI. Cardinal Burke has written and spoken widely on Roman Catholic canon law, as well as on the Holy Eucharist, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe, and the sanctity of human life."

We should all be rightfully proud and thankful to God for our parish having had a role in bringing forth such a good and holy priest, bishop and cardinal. Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
