

From your pastor ...

I take this opportunity to wish our mothers a very blessed and happy Mother's Day. Thank you for all you do for your family. The love and care received from a mother is one of the best ways we experience the love and care that comes from above through God. May eternal rest and peace be granted to our mothers who have left this life marked by the sign of faith.

In past columns you may recall that in anticipation and preparation for the nation-wide Eucharistic revival that is being promoted throughout all the diocese in the United States by the Catholic Conference of Bishops, I had been sharing with you excepts from Cardinal Raymond L. Burke's book entitled: <u>Divine Love Made Flesh: The Holy Eucharist as the Sacrament of Charity.</u>

I would now like to share with you now and in the future excerpts from a book from Father John A. Hardon, S.J., entitled: <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u>. This book is presented in the form of questions with short answers, which may be more conducive for presenting in this column. I hope that you will find this format helpful in coming to a deeper appreciation of the Real Presence of Jesus present on the altar at Mass and present in Holy Communion. The text from Father Hardon's catechism will appear in *italics*.

What is the most precious treasure of the Catholic Church? The most precious treasure of the Catholic Church is the Holy Eucharist, which is the most fundamental truth of the Catholic Faith.

How is the Holy Eucharist the Church's most precious treasure? The Holy Eucharist is the Church's most precious treasure because it is the pledge of Christ's immense love. Nowhere else does Christ manifest His love more deeply than in the Eucharist.

What was the mind of the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council regarding the Holy Eucharist? Their mind was to have believers participate in the Holy Eucharist with sound faith and with utmost devotion. The reason was obvious; the grace that we receive from the Holy Eucharist depends on the soundness of our faith in the Blessed Sacrament and our love which depends on the strength and clarity of the faith in our minds.

How is the Holy Eucharist related to the sacred liturgy? The liturgy holds the first place in the life of the Church, and the Eucharistic mystery stands at the heart and center of the liturgy.

Why should this be true?

This is true because the Holy Eucharist is the font of life by which we are cleansed and strengthened to live, not for ourselves but for God, and to be united in love among ourselves.

How are faith and devotion related?

There is an indissoluble bond between faith and devotion. Faith is the foundation for devotion, and we practice devotion with our wills. But our wills are blind faculties. They depend on our minds. Our devotion is only as pleasing to God and efficacious in obtaining His grace as our faith through our intellect is in possession of the truths which he revealed.

I hope that you can spend the remainder of this day with your families as you celebrate the wonderful gift from God the not only comes in the Holy Eucharist, but the gift of his mother, Mary as well as your mother, who gave you life and love.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's parish.
