

### From your pastor . . .

This next Saturday and Sunday we celebrate the anniversary of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. There are three Masses scheduled to celebrate this wonderful Feast Day of Christmas. The Vigil Mass will be celebrated at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, December 24<sup>th</sup>. A midnight Mass will be celebrated at 12:00 a.m. and the Mass for Christmas Day will be celebrated on December 25<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. The 9:00 a.m. Mass will not use incense.

On the weekend of December 31<sup>st</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup> which celebrates the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, we return to our usual times: vigil mass on Saturday at 5:15 p.m. and Sunday Masses as 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. This will also be the same with the Feast of the Epiphany celebrated the next weekend, January 7-8<sup>th</sup>.

I wish to use the remainder of this column to share with you what our parish grief support specialist, Colleen Pulvermacher recently shared with me and asked if I would help distribute it, which I most certainly am pleased to do. At the bottom of this information concerning "Grieving through the holidays" you will find Colleen's phone number if you would like to speak with her personally and confidentially.

### Grieving through the Holidays – How to Help

While most people readily understand that the holiday season can be difficult for those who are grieving, they are often unsure how to help. You might consider these suggestions.

Reach out to your friend by asking directly how they are doing with the holiday's coming.

**Follow up by asking,** "What would be most helpful to you?" Consider helping with holiday tasks, offering to sit with them at Mass, or taking a walk together. Allow the griever to choose the degree of help and companionship they would like.

**Invite – without expectation.** Sometimes as the event arrives, the griever may pull away. While disappointing for family and friends, this is completely natural as the individual finds their way through grief in their own time. Don't be offended or push your friend to participate if they don't want to.

**Give them permission to scale back.** Beyond our beautiful faith traditions, the commercialism of the holiday can be stressful and loaded with unrealistic expectations. Reassure your friend that it's OK to step back from traditional expectations such as decorating, baking, buying gifts, and sending cards.

**Don't assume you know how they feel.** Ask – and listen if they want to talk. Time is the best gift we can give to a griever. Just be there and know that shared silence is a form of support.

Let go of a timeline – Grievers often hear "it's been a year, it's time to move on." Each person's experience with grief is different and, while well intentioned, this comment is off -putting and not helpful to those who are grieving.

**Talk about their loved one - -** People often report the most hurtful thing is when no one mentions the person who died. Loved ones want to know the person mattered and is missed. Using their name, you might ask, "what was his/her favorite thing about the holidays?" The answers can lead to new traditions that honor the loved one's memory.
