

From your pastor . . .

I again take this opportunity to extend to you a most blessed Easter Season. It was a wonderful experience to be able to join with so many of you in our Holy Week services this past week. The Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass attendance was comparable to past Easter Sundays. Last year you may recall that the attendance at a Mass was limited to ten people including the celebrants. As we move forward in our attendance we must still be vigilant so that we don't inadvertently involve ourselves in a situation that could spread the virus or a variant of it. You will notice that we have opened up more of the pews for use. You must use your own judgment as to how close you want to be seated to others who are not members of your family.

On a related matter, you are most likely aware that the Wisconsin Supreme Court ruled as illegitimate the mandatory order to wear a mask in the state of Wisconsin. It is the mandate that has been judged to be illegitimate, not the wearing of masks per se if a person chooses to do so.

On this point, Bishop Callahan has written to the Faithful of the Diocese and has asked his priests to make known his view on this matter. I will do so by reproducing his letter below, appearing in *italics*.

31 March 2021 Year of Saint Joseph Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, May the Lord give you peace. I write today in light of the decision by the Wisconsin Supreme Court to overturn the statewide mask mandate. It remains a difficult challenge during this time to balance our needs with the need to protect public health. We are all called to make sacrifices that will benefit others so I am strongly encouraging that our Churches and schools continue the practice of having individuals wear masks while participating from a safe social distance.

Please keep in mind that while I am strongly encouraging this practice many of our cities and counties have their own mask mandates that will remain in effect regardless of the decision by the state Legislature. Cities such as Eau Claire, La Crosse, Menominee and Wausau are just a few of the cities that have issued their own mask mandate so please make sure that you are aware of what the mandate is for your area and encourage your parishioners, staff and student to abide by what is mandated.

Although we seem to be moving in a positive direction with Wisconsin becoming one of the lead states, by percentage of population vaccinated, the recent increase in cases in the state reminds us that we are still fighting the battle against this pandemic. The exercise of limitations, such as wearing masks and social distancing, as difficult and frustrating as they may be, should be viewed as charitable act offered for others. If we all do this simple thing and embrace this small sacrifice, we can do our part to ensure that everyone stays healthy and that our churches and schools can remain safe environments for all to participate.

Let us continue our work in Christ showing his love by caring for one another. May the glory and promise of this Easter season bring peace and happiness to you and those you hold most dear.
