

From your pastor . . .

By the time that you are reading this column, a mailing from the Diocesan Annual Appeal office should have arrived at your residence. If this has not happened, please let us know at the rectory so that we can address the matter. Hopefully, you have had an opportunity to review the contents of the mailing and will be considering a response to the request to support the work of our Diocese through the Annual Appeal. Thank you.

As in the past, the remainder of this column will be used to reproduce a part of Father John A. Hardon's <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u>. This is being done for the purpose of supporting the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place in every diocese throughout the United States. (The abbreviated reference (MF) refers to Pope Paul VI's encyclical letter, Mysterium Fidei, published September 3, 1965.

72. How is Christ present in the Church in her pilgrimage of struggle?

Christ is present in our pilgrimage through life on earth on our way to heaven. Except for the light and strength that only He can provide, we could never reach our heavenly destiny. When He said, "Without me you can do nothing", He meant we can do nothing on earth in the Church militant to reach the Church triumphant except through the assistance of His grace. (MF 43).

73. How is Christ present in the Church when she preaches the Gospel?

He is present in the Church when she preaches the Gospel in three ways. Without His grace, the Church would not profess the Gospel of Christ. With His grace the Church's preaching of God's word is accepted by those who are willing to listen. Finally, by His grace the Gospel message produces an abundant fruit of virtue that would be impossible except by the power of Jesus Christ. (MF 44).

74. How is Christ present in the Church as she governs her members?

He is present in the Church when she governs the members of the Mystical Body in three ways. The Church's government is finally vested in the successors of the Apostles under the successor of St. Pater. Christ Himself ordains the Church's bishops. Christ further provides those who are governing the Church with the wisdom they need to guide the faithful according to His will. Finally, Christ is present in the faithful who respond to the Church's government by giving them the grace of humble obedience to those in ecclesiastical authority because they recognize the authority as coming from Christ Himself. (MF 45).

75. How is Christ present in the Sacrifice of the Mass?

He is present in the Sacrifice of the Mass by conferring the graces that He won for us by His bloody death on Calvary. We cannot repeat too often that Christ instituted the Sacrifice of the Mass in order to communicate the divine blessing which He earned for the human race by His bloody death on the cross. (MF 4)

76. How is Christ present in the Church's administration of the sacraments?

He is present in her administration of the sacraments by infallibly granting the grace which each sacrament signifies. This is the foundation of the efficacy of the sacraments. It derives not from the liturgical celebration but directly from Christ Himself who ensure the efficacy of the sacraments as head of the Mystical Body. (MF 46).


