

From your pastor . ..

Beginning next weekend, we will be celebrating Catholic Schools Week throughout the Dioceses of the United States. This is an important celebration for our parish in that we have been blessed with an education through a Catholic school since 1927. Catholic schools' week provides an important opportunity to first give thanks to God and then to those many parishioners living and deceased for making our Catholic school possible.

This year we have an enrollment of 165 students, preschool through eighth grade. This is an increase of 30 students from last year. Like most institutions we are navigating with prudence and caution through the experience of COVID-19. I wish to acknowledge the very good leadership of our principal, Mrs. Stacia Kohlstedt and the staff and faculty who have been instrumental in providing an in-person education to our students. Also, the patience and cooperation of our school parents and families should be acknowledged as well. Thank you.

One improvement that was made in our school over this past Christmas break was the installation of eleven air handling units – LED purification systems, one for each classroom. The total cost for this project was \$13,849.61. I have become convinced that purification of the air that is being breathed is as important if not more so than wiping down hard surfaces with chemical solutions. A particular thank you to our custodian, Patrick Schwingle for overseeing this project.

In addition to the cost mentioned above, this is a good opportunity to share with the parish some pertinent financial numbers concerning the operation of our Catholic School. What is listed below are numbers from the 2020-2021 school year.


