Jesus, I Trust in You!

From your pastor . . .

This second Sunday of Easter which brings to a conclusion the Easter Octave is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. It has its origin with the private revelations that were given to a young Polish nun, Sister (now Saint) Faustina Kowalska. On February 22, 1931 Saint Faustina saw a vision of Jesus with rays of mercy streaming from the area of His Heart. He told her to have an image painted to represent this vision and to sign it “*Jesus I Trust in You.*” A replication of this image is displayed underneath the statue of the Blessed Mother Altar in our church.

Calling her the Apostle and Secretary of His mercy, our Lord requested for her to begin writing a diary so others would learn to trust in Him. This diary has been widely published and can be purchased in any Catholic bookstore or online.

In a series of revelations, He taught Faustina that His mercy is unlimited and available even to the greatest sinners, and He revealed special ways for people to respond to His mercy.

By the time of Saint Faustina’s death in 1938, devotion to Divine Mercy had already begun to spread throughout Eastern Europe. Returning U.S. soldiers who had been exposed to the devotion during World War II were some of the first people to bring it to the United States.

The message of mercy can be called to mind simply by remembering ABC. Ask for His mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly. Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. Complete trust. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust.

The image that Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to have painted is a portrait of Jesus as the King of Mercy. The red and pale rays represent the blood and water that flowed from his pierced Heart as a fountain of mercy for us. There are different versions of the image, but our Lord made it clear that the painting itself is not what is important. So, no matter what version you prefer, you can be assured that God’s graces are communicated through it.

Our Lord asked for special prayer at the hour of his death – the three o’clock hour. Usually the Chaplet of Mercy is prayed at this hour (however it can be prayed at any hour). The Chaplet is prayed on the beads of the rosary. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed immediately after the conclusion of the weekday Masses at our parish church.

Jesus also requested (as recorded in Saint Faustina’s Diary, 699) that the Sunday after Easter be officially established in the Church as the Feast of Mercy. This was done by then Pope Saint John Paul II.

We bring forth great goodness into our world and the lives of others when we carry out the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy. A particular thank you to those who recently contributed so generously to the corporal needs of those who are suffering in Ukraine.

A reminder that next Saturday, April 30th is our Sportsman’s Extravaganza beginning at 6:00 p.m. at the Richland Center Community Center. There will be food, raffles and door prizes available. The drawing for the 40 acres of hunting land or \$25,000 takes place @ 9:30 p.m. Come and enjoy the evening supporting your parish when you do so.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary Parish.

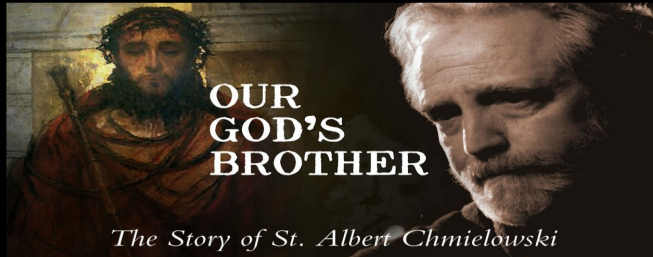
