

From your pastor . . .

We have entered the season of Advent which concerns itself with the "advancement" or "coming" of someone – in this case, the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The first two Sundays (and weeks) concern the coming of our Lord Jesus in glory at the end of time. The third and the fourth Sundays (and weeks) of Advent concern the coming of our Lord Jesus that has already happened, his coming in humility when he was born in a stable in Bethlehem.

Related to our preparation for the celebration of Jesus coming in humility is the historical fact that this Christmas marks the 800th year anniversary of Saint Francis of Assisi 's first presentation of what is known as the "Creche" or crib scene that depicts Jesus' birth into our world. It was in the year 1223 AD that the saint known for his humility and voluntary poverty constructed a nativity scene in Assisi, Italy. It has become a mainstay in Catholic piety since that time.

To commemorate this anniversary, the Diocese of La Crosse has written a prayer entitle "THE CRIB" that is printed on the back of a holy card that depicts Mary and Joseph with the newborn Christ child. This holy card is available on the tables near the entry/exits of the church. You are invited to take one with you and encourage to pray the prayer written by Bishop William P. Callahan.

The season of Advent is also a penitential season. To prepare for Christmas we are to prepare our souls to receive the powerful graces that come to us through the Christmas liturgies. The very best way to make this preparation is by making a confession of your sins and receiving absolution through the Sacrament of Penance. To that end, I am listing below the extended dates and times prior to Christmas for confessions as well as the Rite of Confession that, if needed, you can clip bring to the confessional.

Order for Making a Good Confession

Priest: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Penitent: Amen

Penitent: Bless me Father for I have sinned. My last confession was ______ ago and these are my sins. (At this point you make a complete confession of your sins to the best of your recollection.) ... and I am sorry for these and all the sins of my life.

(The priest will give you words of counsel and assign your penance)

Penitent: (Recites this Act of Contrition or any other one they may wish to use) O My God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you. And I detest all my sins because of thy just punishments. But most of all because they offend you my God who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of your grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

Priest: (Recites the prayer of absolution) God the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, + and of the Holy Spirit.


Penitent: Amen.

Penitent: Thanks be to God. (You now leave the confessional to carry out your assigned penance.)
