### From your pastor ...

I hope you all had a good Thanksgiving Day celebration. I suspect that for many of us certain things were changed due to the COVID situation. Hopefully you were able to spend time with your family. I was able to enjoy a meal with my two older brothers and my sister-in-law at the farm. The next day, Friday I spent in the woods hunting and bagged a second deer, insuring that we will have enough venison for the summer sausage that we serve at the <u>Sportsman's Extravaganza that is scheduled for Saturday, April 17<sup>th</sup></u>. It will depend on whether or not the Richland Center Community Center is permitting events with crowds to take place as to whether or not we have the Extravaganza. You may recall that last year we had to cancel as a result of the Center's decision not to host any events. I read in the Wisconsin State Journal that the Madison Symphony has already cancelled their season through May of 2021 – so it not looking very promising – but perhaps Richland Center will be better off than Madison as we move through the new year.

I wish to express my gratitude to all who have made a contribution to the Diocesan Annual Appeal. Through your generosity we have surpassed the assigned amount of \$33,855.00. If you have not yet made a contribution to the Appeal, please do so in the near future. Thank you.

One would think that with a successful Diocesan Annual Appeal we would have some time to be free from any other campaigns, but that is not going to be so this year. On the weekend of December 12-13, the Diocese is announcing a campaign that is to include all of the parishes in the Diocese for the repair and restoration of the Cathedral of Saint Joseph the Workman. This campaign is being conducted under the title of: **Christ Our Cornerstone**.

The Cathedral was constructed in the early 1960's and is presently facing some severe difficulties with some of the stones loosening and falling, which has required closing off the main entrance from public use. There are a number of repairs that need to be done throughout the building with the cost being estimated at \$6.1 million. Thus far the Campaign has raised \$2.5 million from the parishioners of the Cathedral Parish with the assistance of a \$2 for \$1 match provided by Saint Ambrose Financial Services.

It is important to understand that while the Cathedral has its own parishioners who belong to her, she is also the Mother Church of the entire Diocese. It is at the Cathedral that our Priests and Deacons are ordained. From there they are sent to bring Christ's mission and their ministry to serve across our entire diocese. At the annual Chrism Mass, the holy oils are blessed and the chrism is consecrated to be sent and used in all of our parishes for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Anointing of the Sick. While the Cathedral is located in La Crosse, its impact is diocesan wide. As Christ is the cornerstone of our Faith, the Cathedral is the cornerstone of our diocese.

On the weekend of December 12-13, all parishioners will be asked to participate in this campaign. I hope that you will once again respond generously as you have in the past when asked to participate in such fundraising. This will be a onetime request. Materials will be made available that will further explain the necessity of this campaign and how you can participate. A fundraising firm, Lynch Development Associates is assisting the Diocese in carrying out this campaign.

Along with the **Christ Our Cornerstone** campaign, Bishop Callahan has also written to all of his priests/pastors to re-emphasize the importance of following the regulations he set forth for our Diocese concerning COVID 19. Apparently he has been receiving correspondence from some people in the Diocese who are concerned that his directives are not being followed. I will publish the Bishop's concerns and regulations in my next column.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary Parish.


