

From your pastor . . .

I received the welcomed news this past week that Father Matthew Marshall has been named the new pastor of the Annunciation of the BVM Parish in Viroqua, where I had been appointed parish administrator. Father Marshall was ordained in 2014 and had been serving as pastor of Saint Mary's, Coon Valley and as the Aquinas Middle School chaplain. He was replaced as chaplain at Aquinas so that he can now take on his new responsibilities in Viroqua. For obvious reasons I am very pleased that he has been appointed pastor and I look forward to working with him in the Richland Deanery.

This Saturday afternoon at the 5:15 Mass we will be celebrating the Rite of Confirmation of 14 of our parish youth in the context of the Solemnity of Mary's Assumption into Heaven. This as our parish feast day and it provides a wonderful occasion for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Bishop Callahan has delegated the authority to confer the Sacrament to parish pastors during this time of pandemic. It is recommended that when a priest replaces the Bishop, the Church's official instruction to the *Confirmandi* be used in the rite. I will do that and I reproduce it here so that you may have an opportunity to refresh your own understanding of this important Sacrament.

The Apostles, who had received the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost in fulfillment of the Lord's promise, had power to complete the work of Baptism by the giving of the Holy Spirit, as we read in the Acts of the Apostles. When Saint Paul had laid his hands on certain people who had been baptized, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied.

The Bishops, as successors of the Apostles, possess the same power and, either in their own right or through Priests lawfully appointed to fulfill this ministry, they confer the Holy Spirit on those who have already been born again in Baptism.

Even if today the coming of the Holy Spirit is no longer widely made manifest by the gift of tongues, we know by f aith that the Spirit, through whom the love of God has been poured into our hearts and through whom we are gathered in unity of faith and in diversity of callings, is received by us and is working invisibly to make the Church holy and one.

Dearly beloved, the gift of the Holy Spirit, which you are about to receive, will be a spiritual seal, by which you will be conformed to Christ and will be made more fully members of his Church. For Christ himself, anointed by the Holy Spirit in the baptism he received from John, was sent forth for the work of his ministry, to pour out on the earth the fire of the same Spirit.

Therefore, you who are already baptized will now receive the power of his Spirit and be signed with his Cross on your foreheads. And so, you must always bear witness to his Passion and Resurrection before the world, so that your manner of life, as the Apostle says, may be in every place the pleasing fragrance of Christ. His Mystical Body, which I s the Church, the People of God, receives from diverse graces, which the same Holy Spirit distributes to individuals for the building up of that Body in unity and love.

Be living member of this Church, therefore, and, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, seek to serve all people like Christ, who came not to be served but to serve.

We congratulate our newly confirmed parishioners and look forward to their service to Christ through their parish.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
