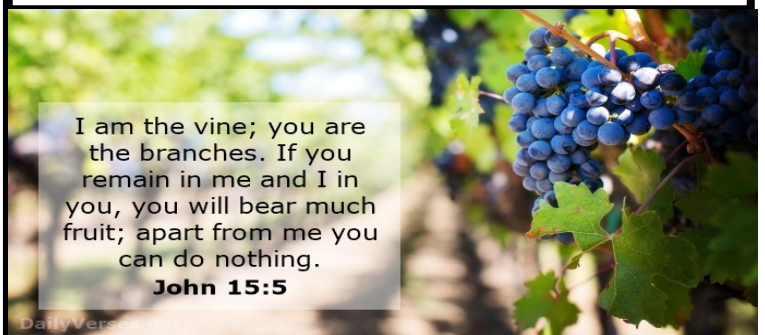

From your pastor . . .

I apologize to those of you who read this column regularly, in that this is the third consecutive time, I am communicating practically the same message regarding the upcoming Diocesan Annual Appeal. As I have mentioned in the past, people that study the various methods of effectiveness in communication maintain that to reach a diverse audience such as the people who make up a Catholic parish like ours at Saint Mary's, requires at least three consecutive communications.

This week, a mailing will be coming to your homes from the Diocesan Appeal Office that will ask for your financial support through this year's Annual Appeal. In this mailing you will find a letter from Bishop Callahan, a brochure explaining the work that will be accomplished in the diocese through the Appeal, a pledge card, and a return envelope.

This year's message takes its inspiration from the passage in Ecclesiastes 4:12: "Where one alone may be overcome, two together can resist. A three-ply cord is not easily broken." Bishop Callahan has asked that this message of strength and unity permeate within our parishes as well as between all the parishes in the Diocese, emphasizing the importance of being together as a community of faith, particularly during a time when there is so much separation and isolation within our society.

The Diocesan-wide goal of \$6,000,000 is the same amount as last year's goal. Based on a somewhat complex formula (which your pastor has studied and finds to be fair) each parish is responsible for a certain assigned portion of the diocesan goal. **The amount that Saint Mary's Parish is being asked to provide is: \$33,805. This is \$1,105 less than what was expected from us last year.**

Please be attentive to the mailing that should arrive this week. When it arrives, please consider the request and make a generous response. In Bishop Callahan's letter asking me to organize the Appeal among the parishioners of Saint Mary's, he also asked me personally for a gift of \$600, which I have given.

With the start of the campaign this week, it is my hope that we will bring it to a conclusion by the Third Sunday of Advent, December 17th. Obviously, if you donate after the 17th, it will be appreciated and included in our parish's assigned amount. Thank you for taking the time to consider and respond with your support for the Diocese through the Annual Appeal.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
