Display of the Eucharistic Miracles

#### From your pastor . . .

We will continue with the presentation by Father John A. Hardon, S.J., founder of the Marian Catechist Apostolate on the Holy Eucharist as it appears in his <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u>. Father Hardon refers often to the encyclical letter *Mysterium Fidei*, <u>The Mystery of Faith</u>, (MF), written by Pope Saint Paul VI. The catechesis in this column on the Holy Eucharist is meant to correspond with the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout the Dioceses in the United States.

#### 44. Did not Christ die once and for all for our sins?

Yes. Christ's death on the cross merited all the graces that a sinful world needs to be redeemed. But, the Sacrifice of the Mass, as the re-presentation of Calvary, communicates these graces which the Savior won for us on the first Good Friday, (MF 28).

#### 45. When did Christ institute the mystery of the Eucharist?

He instituted the mystery of the Eucharist at the Last Supper when, as the Evangelist tells us, Jesus took bread, and blessed and broke it and gave it to the apostles, saying, "This is my Body, given for you; do this for a commemoration of me." And so with the chalice, when supper was ended, "This cup," He said, "is the New Testament, in my blood which is to be shed for you." (MF 29)

#### 46. When did Jesus institute the Sacrament of the Priesthood?

Jesus instituted the sacrament of the priesthood at the Last Supper. He did so, Pope Paul VI declares, "bidding the Apostles to do this in memory of Him." He thus "made clear His will that the same sacrifice be forever repeated." (MF 29)

**47.** When did the Church put into practice Christ's commandment to offer the Sacrifice of the Mass? The Church faithfully executed Christ's intention from the first day of the primitive Church. She did so by her adherence to the teaching of the Apostles and through her gatherings summoned to celebrate the Eucharistic sacrifice. (MF 30)

#### 48. What did Saint Luke say about this practice?

St. Luke carefully testifies about what happened from Pentecost Sunday on. The new converts to Christianity "occupied themselves continually with the Apostolic teaching, their fellowship in the breaking of bread, and the fixed times of prayer." In the vocabulary of St. Luke the expression "breaking of bread" is synonymous with the offering of the Sacrifice of the Mass. (MF 30)

#### 49. What were the benefits which the early Christians obtained from participating in the Mass?

From the Mass, they obtained such spiritual strength that it was said them, "there was one heart and soul in all the company of believers." This phenomenon of selfless charity was the single most effective witness that the early Christians offered to their contemporaries. It was also the means that Christ used to convert so many pagans of the Roman Empire to Christianity. (MF 31)

#### 50. What does St. Paul say about the Sacrifice of the Mass?

He warns the Christians of all times against participating in the Eucharistic Sacrifice and participating in the pagan sacrifices of their day. (MF 31)

#### 51. How important is St. Paul's warning today?

It is most important. There is a growing tendency among professed Catholics, who may attend the Sacrifice of the Mass, to compromise with the secularism in modern society. In effect, they are trying to do the impossible: to profess their Catholic faith by attending Mass while their live are a profession of self-idolatry which is the prevalent paganism of our day, (MF 31).

Let us not grow weary in petitioning our Lord for an abundant rainfall. Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.


# 15 August The Assumption of Our Lady
