

From your pastor . . .

We will continue with the presentation by Father John A. Hardon, S.J., founder of the Marian Catechist Apostolate on the Holy Eucharist as it appears in his <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u>. Father Hardon refers often to the encyclical letter *Mysterium Fidei*, <u>The Mystery of Faith</u>, (MF), written by Pope Saint Paul VI. The catechesis in this column on the Holy Eucharist is meant to correspond with the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout the Dioceses in the United States.

52. Do we participate in Christ's sacrifice through the Mass?

We do participate in Christ's sacrifice because, in the Mass, Christ is truly offering Himself to His Heavenly Father. It is the same Jesus who died on the Cross and who is now offering Himself to His Heavenly Father in every Mass celebrated by the Catholic Church, (MF 32).

53. Does the Mass atone for sins?

The Mass atones for sins twice over, for the sins that we have personally committed and also for the sins of other people, (MF 31).

54. Is the Mass a source of grace for help from God?

Indeed, the Mass is the single most effective source for obtaining the graces we need. This means that the Mass obtains for us the light we need for the mind to know God's will in our lives, and the strength we need for our will to do the will of God, no matter how demanding the divine will may be.

55. How important is St. Cyril of Jerusalem in our understanding of the Holy Eucharist?

St. Cyril of Jerusalem (315-386 A.D.) wrote what may be call the first extensive catechism of the Catholic Church. His catechism has become a standard for catechetical instruction for the past sixteen hundred years. This is crucially important to keep in mind when so many professedly Catholic theologians and liturgists are claiming that the Eucharist as a sacrifice is somehow outdated in the Catholic Church, (MF 32).

56. What are some of the blessings that St. Cyril tells us we should expect to obtain through the Sacrifice of the Mass?

He declares, "After the Spiritual Sacrifice, the unbloody act of worship has been completed. Bending over this propitiatory offering we beg God to grant peace to all the Churches, to give harmony to the whole world, to bless our rulers, our soldiers, and our companions, to aid the sick and afflicted, and in general to assist all who stand in need, and then we offer the Victim also for our deceased holy ancestors and bishops, and for all our dead. As we do this, we are filled with conviction that this Sacrifice will be of the greatest help to those souls for whom prayers are being offered in the very presence of our holy and awesome Victim," (MF 33).

57. How is the Mass a sacrifice of propitiation for sin?

Propitiation means that God is asked for mercy on sinners. He is asked for mercy to remove their guilt, which is the loss of divine grace. He is also asked to spare His punishments, which are the penalty due for sins committed. In both ways the Sacrifice of the Mass is the most powerful source of propitiation that we must obtain God's mercy on us sinners, (MF 34).

We give thanks to God for the rainfall that came to our area this past week. We need more, so let us not hesitate to humbly ask God in prayer for what we need. Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's parish.






