

### From your pastor ...

We will return to the question-and-answer format concerning the Real Presence of Christ that appears in Father John A. Hardon, <u>The Catechism of the Real Presence</u>. This presentation is being done in consort with the various initiatives that the Bishops of the United States are taking at this time in what is termed: A National Eucharistic Revival. In the month of October, the 26<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>, a presentation of the Eucharistic Miracles that have been authenticated by the Catholic Church will be on display in the undercroft of our Church. A schedule with more information will be forthcoming.

Now we return to Father Hardon's presentation, that makes frequent reference to the Encyclical, Mysterium Fidei (Mystery of Faith) promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1965. The abbreviation MF followed by a number indicates what Father Hardon is presenting and from which paragraph of the Encyclical.

#### 58. Is the Sacrifice of the Mass also to be offered for the deceased?

Yes, as St. Augustine observes, this was the practice from the dawn of Christianity, especially in the city of Rome. To be kept in mind, however, is that the Mass is a sacrifice of propitiation for the souls in purgatory in order to deliver them from the sufferings which their sins deserved. It is here especially that the Catholic Church differs totally from the position among Protestants, who do not believe either in purgatory or in praying and offering Mass for the deliverance of the poor souls from their sufferings (MF 35).

#### 59. Can we say that the Church offers and is offered in the Sacrifice of the Mass?

Yes, the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ both offers herself and is offered by Christ in every mass said throughout the world. However, we must carefully distinguish between the role of the priest who says the Mass and the faithful by and for whom the Mass is being offered. Except for the priest, there would be no Sacrifice of the Mass. Why not? Because without the priestly power of consecration, Christ would not be really and corporeally present on the altar. We may distinguish the role of the priest from that of the faithful by saying that the priest brings Christ down on the altar objectively; whereas the faithful are to unite themselves subjectively with Jesus who is offering Himself on the altar though the hands and voice and the intentions are of the priest, (MF 36).

#### 60. What is the difference between the universal priesthood and the hierarchical priesthood?

As explained above, the hierarchical priesthood is the exercise of the power that only ordained priests possess. It is the power to change bread and wine into the living Christ, and the corresponding power of re-presenting Christ's sacrifice on Calvary by the double consecration performed by the priest in every Mass. The universal priesthood pertains to all the baptized. They have the privilege of joining themselves with Christ in His sacrifice to the heavenly Father, which takes place every time the Mass is celebrated. Thus, the hierarchical priesthood is the foundation for the exercise of the universal priesthood of the faithful (MF 37).

#### 61. How important is understanding the meaning of the Mass?

Pope Paul VI does not hesitate to say that the understanding of the Mass is at the bedrock of Christian life and sanctity, (MF 37).

#### 62. Why is this true?

It is true because Christ instituted the Sacrifice of the Mass as our principal source of grace to live lives of sacrifice in imitation of the Savior. Sacrifice means the surrender of something precious out of love for God. The Mass offers us the grace we need to live sacrificial lives. However, our benefiting from the Mass is conditioned on our understanding the meaning of the Mass, (MF 37).

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
