

#### From your pastor ...

Every year, each parish in the Diocese of La Crosse hosts a missionary who makes an appeal for support to further the missionary activity throughout the Universal Church. This is called the Mission Coop Appeal. This next weekend (September 23-24), our parish will be hosting Father Peter Raj who will make an appeal on behalf of the Diocese of Vellore in India.

Father Peter Raj was born (1976) and raised in India, ordained for the Vellore Diocese in 2005. He served his first 8 years in his home diocese and then came to the Diocese of La Crosse where he has served for 12 years. At the present he is the pastor at Camp Douglas, Indian Creek and New Lisbon, the three places where our former associate, Fr. Rober Letona had been pastor.

I am certain Father Raj will tell you about the specific needs of the Vellore Diocese, however I will give you a brief introduction in this column.

The Diocese of Vellore is 82% Hindu, with the Christian (Catholic) religion comprising less than 3% of the population. The government, which is controlled by Hindus, favor their own while engaging in harassment of Christians, e.g., disconnecting the power/electricity on Christmas and Easter. Other forms of discrimination, such as the denial of government assistance and scholarships to young people to advance in education are often directed against Christians.

In the Diocese of Vellore there are 118 priests with many consecrated women religious who carry the responsibility of caring for the most vulnerable people, particularly orphans and elderly. The Diocese operates 21 schools, 4 orphanages and one hospice care center. The people of Vellore are some of the poorest in India with illiteracy, unemployment, and alcoholism present throughout the population. An annual salary is \$1,000 to \$1,200.

Next weekend an envelope for the Vellore Diocese will be attached to the bulletin. After listening to Father Raj's presentation please consider making a donation, using the envelope to do so. A second collection will be taken up on Sunday, Sept.30-Oct.1.

Also, next Sunday at the 8:00 a.m. Mass, the catechists from our parish will be asked to come forward after the recitation of the Creed to receive the "Blessing for Catechists" that will be administered by Deacon Tully. A special thank you and a promise of remembrance in our prayer for all catechists who serve our parish of Saint Mary's.

I wish to thank all who were involved in helping with the Parish Festival. An accounting of the success of the parish festival will be forthcoming.

This will be my last column for a few weeks, in that I will be taking some vacation. For the past 48 consecutive Sundays you have seen and heard me while celebrating Mass, so having a break from me will probably be a good thing.

In my absence, after Father Raj's missionary appeal, Father Kurt Apfelbeck, who has filled in for me in the past, will be here to celebrate the Masses assisted by Deacon Tully. If there are any pastoral emergencies during my absence, please contact the rectory and a priest will be notified to respond.

I will be traveling first to Florida and then by ship to Barcelona, Spain (provided the hurricanes don't reappear in the Atlantic Ocean). Please keep me in your prayers and I will remember all of you when I celebrate Mass.

Until I write again, (which will be a number of weeks), may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.

#### RCIA and Inquiry Class to Begin

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process whereby unbaptized adults, adults baptized in another Christian tradition, adult Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist, Penance, or Confirmation are prepared to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. The classes are also open to practicing Catholics who want to learn more about their faith. It is important to note that if you enter the RCIA program and along the way change your mind as to embracing the Catholic faith, you can leave the program without any difficulty. The Faith can only be embraced freely and without any coercion.

Classes are 60-90 minutes and are held one evening each week beginning September 11, 2023 at 7:00PM in the Commons, 789 N. Central, across the street from St. Mary School.
