

From your pastor...

In this column we continue with the presentation by Father John A. Hardon, S.J., founder of the Marian Catechist Apostolate on the Holy Eucharist as it appears in his <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u> (printed in *italics*). Father Hardon refers often to the encyclical letter *Mysterium Fidei*, The Mystery of Faith, written by Pope Saint Paul VI. This catechesis on the Holy Eucharist is being done to correspond with the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout all the Diocese in the United States.

18. What is the first error about the Real Presence which the Pope condemns?

He condemns the error of transignification. Transignification is the heretical view of Christ's presence in the Eucharist which claims that the meaning or significance of the bread and wine is changed by the words of consecration. The consecrated elements are said to signify all that Christians associate with the Last Supper; they have a higher value than merely food for the body. The theory of transignification was condemned by Pope Paul VI in the encyclical Mysterium Fidei (1965) if it is understood as denying transubstantiation. The German theologian Karl Rahner is commonly identified as the chief proponent of this erroneous teaching about the Real Presence (MF 10).

19. What is the second significant error about the Real Presence condemned by Pope Paul VI?

It is the error of transfinalization. It is very similar to the theory of transignification. But here it is claimed that Christ is not really present in the Eucharist. Rather, the purpose or finality of the bread and wine are changed by the words of consecration. They are said to serve a new function as sacred elements that arouse the faith of the people in the mystery of Christ's redemptive love. Along with Karl Rahner, the Dutch theologian Edward Schilebeeckx was the chief promoter of this erroneous theory. Both transignification and prefinalization have deeply penetrated into the theological literature used by priests and the laity in the western world. (MF 10)

20. What are the consequences of these errors?

Pope Paul VI sees great harm to the faith and devotion to the Divine Eucharist. He wrote this judgment in 1965. Since then, the damage to the Eucharistic faith and devotion of millions of once believing Catholics has been enormous. It can safely be said that this is the root cause of the widespread apostasy in one so-called developed country after another. (MF 11)

21. Why did Pope Paul VI publish Mysterium Fidei?

He did so for two reasons. In his own words, he wanted to strengthen the "Eucharistic piety which is now pervading the whole church." Moreover, he wished to protect this Eucharistic devotion from being frustrated by the spread of false ideas about the Holy Eucharist. His concern to protect the Church from the rising dissemination of errors was nothing less than prophetic. (MF 12)

22. Does Eucharistic doctrine need to be investigated?

Yes. The Pope assures us how praiseworthy it is to investigate the lofty mystery of the Eucharist. In fact, we have a duty to penetrate ever more deeply into the meaning and implications of the revealed truth of our faith; here, it is the mystery of the Holy Eucharist. (MF 13)

23. Is the Pope concerned about the damage to the faith produced by the prevalent errors on the Eucharist?

Yes. In fact, he considers himself in duty bound to warn the faithful about the harm which erroneous teachings are doing to the Catholic faith. (MF 14)


