

From your pastor . . .

In this column we continue with the presentation by Father John A. Hardon, S.J., founder of the Marian Catechist Apostolate on the Holy Eucharist as it appears in his <u>Catechism on the Real Presence</u>. Father Hardon refers often to the encyclical letter *Mysterium Fidei*, The Mystery of Faith, written by Pope Saint Paul VI. This catechesis on the Holy Eucharist is being done to correspond with the National Eucharistic Revival that is taking place throughout all the Diocese in the United States.

13. How was the introduction by Pope Paul VI a prelude to what follows in Mysterium Fidei?

It was a prelude to the deep concern of the Pope about the rise of errors regarding the Holy Eucharist. He foresaw that the Catholic liturgy would be only as glorifying to God and as beneficial to us as it preserves the truth about the Blessed Sacrament. Moreover, he looked forward to greater benefits than ever from the Holy Eucharist, provided that the development of Eucharistic doctrine remains consistent with the Church's unchangeable Eucharistic teaching (MF 9).

14. What are some of the Pope's concerns?

He is concerned about what some professedly Catholic writers and speakers are saying regarding: -Masses which are said in private, that is, without a congregation. -the dogma of transubstantiation, solemnly defined by the Council of Trent. -devotion to the Holy Eucharist apart from the Eucharistic liturgy. -ignoring the Church's unchangeable definitions about the Blessed Sacrament. -interpretations of Catholic doctrine that weaken the genuine meaning of the Church's teaching on the Holy Eucharist. 15. Does the Pope encourage what is called 'communal Masses' to the disparagement of private Masses?

No. Just the opposite. It is not allowable, he says, to emphasize what is called the 'communal' Mass to the disparagement of Masses celebrated in private. Behind this mistaken emphasis is the error of claiming that a congregation is essential for the valid and fruitful celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass. There is such wide-spread emphasis on 'togetherness' in the Eucharistic liturgy that the essence of the Sacrifice of the Mass is either forgotten or even denied. This essence is Christ offering Himself to His Heavenly Father, which is signified by the double consecration. Christ is really offering Himself in the Mass, no less truly than He offered Himself on Calvary. The presence and participation of the Faithful at Mass is certainly beneficial to the participation., but their presence is not essential for the Eucharistic sacrifice. (MF 10)

16. How important is the sacramental sign in the Holy Eucharist?

It is certainly important as a means of signifying that the Eucharist is a sacrament. The danger is that people will come to identify the external symbolism with the internal reality.

17. Can the mystery of transubstantiation be discussed without reference to the teaching of the Council of Trent?

No. The council of Trent gives us the most authoritative and definite teaching on the meaning of transubstantiation. According to the Council of Trent, transubstantiation is the change of the whole substance of bread and wine into the whole Christ. The exact words of the Council could not be more clear: "It was always the conviction of the Church, and this holy Council now declares again that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of His blood. This change, the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."

The Eucharist and the Most Holy Trinity -Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Jesus gave His life for us so that our sins can be forgiven and we can be united in a relationship of love with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We refer to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as the most Holy Trinity - three Persons in one God. When we receive the

They are pure spirits and do not have bodies, and so in Sacred Art, our Heavenly Father is represented by a grandfather and the Holy Spirit is rep-

resented by the Biblical image of a dove.
