

From your pastor . . .

This column will continue in our preparation for the Eucharistic revival that is taking place throughout all the Diocese of the United States. Today's installment comes from Cardinal Raymond L. Burke's book entitled: <u>Divine Love Made Flesh: The Holy Eucharist as the Sacrament of Charity</u>, pp.22-23.

Eucharistic Banquet

Christ makes Himself substantially present to us through the Holy Eucharist principally so that we may receive Him in Holy Communion. "The Eucharistic Sacrifice is intrinsically directed to the inward union of the faithful with Christ through Communion", (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, n. 16). The Holy Eucharist is true spiritual food, Christ nourishing the life of the Holy Spirit within us through the reception of His glorious Body and Blood. The sixth chapter of the Gospel of Saint John helps us very much to understand the Eucharistic Banquet. Christ made it clear that only by eating His Body and drinking His Blood do we have life within us. The disciples understood the true importance of His teaching, from that day, some refused to believe and left His company.

Holy Communion, participation in the Eucharistic Banquet, is Christ's way of sustaining His life poured out within us a the moment of our baptism, and strengthened and increased within us from the moment of our confirmation. The Sacraments of Initiation -Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist – are essentially related to one another. "Thus by the gift of his body and blood Christ increases within us the gift of his Spirit, already poured out in Baptism and bestowed as a 'seal' in the sacrament of Confirmation. (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, n.17)

Conclusion

Communion in the Body and Blood of Christ is already now a participation in the fullness of communion with God, which will be ours in the Heavenly Kingdom. The Holy Eucharist is likewise the Spiritual Food to sustain us along life's pilgrimage home to God the Father. In the wonderful words of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, Holy communion is "a medicine of immortality, an antidote to death", (Ad Ephesia, 20). That is why the church so much desires that the dying receive Holy communion and call the Holy Communion of the dying by a special name, Viaticum, food for the journey from this life to the next.


The fact that Holy communion is an anticipation of the life to come also means that it commits us to preparing the day of Christ's Final coming during each moment of our lives. The account of the institution of the Holy Eucharist in the Gospel of Saint John underlines the mandate which the Holy Eucharist is for us. It is a sharing in the outpouring of Christ's life out of love for us and for all; it contains the command to wash the feet of our brothers and sisters. Blessed Pope John Paul II concludes the first chapter of Ecclesia de Eucharistia with these inspiring words:

Proclaiming the death of the Lord "until he comes" (Cor. 11:26) entails that all who take part in in the Eucharist be committed to changing their lives and making them in a certain way completely "Eucharistic," (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, n.20).

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
