

From your pastor ...

Over the past couple of bulletins within this column, I have shared about my Aunt Dolores who has been sick with cancer and whom I visited in September during my trip to Pennsylvania. On Thursday, October 15th my aunt died. Thank you for your prayers for her. May she rest in peace.

I am in the process of beginning the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), which is for anyone who desires to know more about the Catholic Faith and particularly for those who seek to become members of the Church. If you are interested or know someone who is, please have them contact the rectory.

Please be reminded that last Sunday was World Mission Sunday. It always takes place on the third Sunday of October and involves the entire Church throughout the world to sacrifice in support of the missionary activity of the Church. It was Jesus final command to his apostles before he ascended to heaven that they go out to all nations, proclaiming the gospel of salvation and baptizing in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. This has been a continual requirement of being a Catholic – that we support the men and women who serve as missionaries throughout the world. There are envelopes at the end of the pews that can be used to make a contribution. Thank you for your generosity.

Another request being made of the Faithful in the Diocese of La Crosse is the Diocesan Annual Appeal. A mailing should have come to your homes from the Diocese a number of weeks ago. If this has not happened, please let the rectory know and we will make certain that you receive the necessary material for your contribution.

The Diocesan Annual Appeal not only supports the work of the Diocese but also a significant portion of it is sent outside the Diocese to assist our Holy Father as well as provide response to natural disasters that can appear suddenly in different parts of the world. Through the Bishop's Oversees Campaign that is funded by the Appeal, help is made available in a timely way through the Church in those regions where disaster strikes. Also, in our own nation a portion of the Diocesan Annual Appeal is used to support Catholic Charities which provide for the needs of those experiencing hardship within our diocese but also helping when there is a natural catastrophe anywhere in our nation.

I realize this may be a difficult time financially for some of our parishioners, but I ask that you do the best you can in responding to this Appeal. Thank you.

I don't think I need to tell you that there is an election going on and that will reach its culmination next Tuesday, November 3rd. It is important that as Catholics we exercise our right as well as fulfill our duty to vote. I encourage you to go to the website of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops to learn about the platforms that are being promoted by the competing parties and candidates. This will be a consequential election for our nation in many ways. Pray for our nation through the intercession of our patroness, Mary Immaculate, that it will experience peace and tranquility in the days ahead.


