

From your pastor...

As we begin the season of Advent, I would like to encourage you to set up an Advent wreathe in your home. It is a very good way to help the family stay focused on this time of preparation for the coming celebration of the anniversary of Christ's birth. As you are well aware there are many competing interests for your attention and time during these weeks leading up to Christmas, most of them being secular and commercial in nature. The Advent wreathe provides an opportunity for the family to focus "on the reason (Jesus Christ) for the season."

The wreathe can be easily assembled by using evergreen limbs from a tree in the yard and four candles. The evergreen, which retains its green, vibrant life throughout the year, signify continuous life, which signifies the eternal nature of God who comes into the world in the person of Jesus Christ. The evergreen boughs should be placed in a circular position. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning and no end, symbolizes God's eternity, as well as the soul's immortality and the everlasting life found in Christ who was victorious over sin and death through His Passion, Death and Resurrection.

The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. It is not absolutely necessary that three of the candles be violet and one of them rose. It is the flame when lit that is the most important feature of the candle. The color of violet is used because it is a somber color that corresponds to the penitential nature of the Advent season. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent, which is known as *Guadete* (Rejoice) Sunday. The third Sunday is significant in that a "turn" is made in the focus of the Church (and believers) from the second coming of Jesus in glory (emphasized in the readings and prayers of the first two Sundays) to the first coming of Jesus in humility (emphasized in the readings and prayer of the third and fourth Sundays). Please remember, if you do not have colored candles to use, you can use whatever color you have.

The lighting of the four candles is a marking of time that leads to Christmas. The light of the candles shines in the darkness, which is most evident during this time of the year as it is darker due to shorter daylight hours. We use candles in the Advent wreathe and put lights on a Christmas tree, signifying the coming of Christ, who is "the light that came into the world" to dispel sin's darkness and to radiate God's truth and love.

When a candle is lit at the beginning of each week the following prayers may be used. Each day when the candle is lit, the same prayer for the entire week is used.

First Week of Advent: (One candle lit)

Heavenly Father, as we begin this Advent, give light to our eyes and peace to our hearts. May the Lord find us watching and waiting in joy when He comes. We pray in Jesus' name. **Amen.**

Second Week of Advent: (Two candles lit)

Father in heaven, set our hearts ablaze to follow in the steps of John the Baptist. May we bring light and love to all we meet, that the darkness of sin and fear may be overcome. In Christ's name we ask this. **Amen.**

Third Week of Advent: (Three candles lit)

As we draw near to you, Lord God, keep us aware of your presence in all we do. Come with power to enlighten us by your grace, that we may live in praise and peace all our days. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Fourth Week of Advent: (Four candles lit)

Lord Jesus, we approach that holy moment when Your coming as man is renewed in our hearts. Give us peace and allow us to celebrate Your presence with joy, that we may some day share Your glory. We ask this of You, who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, as One God, now and forever. **Amen.**

Hopefully, the above suggestion is something that you will utilize in your home during this holy season of Advent. Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.


